LEGISLATION

<u>CB-2-2012</u> (Olson and Franklin) - An Act concerning Adequate Public Pedestrian and Bikeway Facilities in Centers and Corridors for the purpose of requiring the Planning Board to make a finding of adequacy of public Pedestrian and Bikeway Facilities for development proposals within County Centers and Corridors, to include standards for ensuring the adequacy of non-motorized multimodal transportation facilities including sidewalks, bikeways, and pathways, clarifying requirements for adequate access roads available to serve traffic that would be generated by development projects within proposed subdivisions, and implementing "complete streets" principles and policies in the 2009 Approved Countywide Master Plan of Transportation.
