BILL

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Code Of Ethics

3 For the purpose of amending the Prince George's County Code of Ethics to prohibit former
4 Council Members of Prince George's County from assisting or representing another party for
5 compensation in a matter that is the subject of legislative action from the Prince George's
6 County Government for three calendar years from the date the official leaves County office;
7 prohibiting a former Council Member's compensated representation in certain matters in which
8 they participated as a Council Member; and generally relating to the Prince George's County
9 Code of Ethics.

10 BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

11 SUBTITLE 2. ADMINISTRATION.

12 Section 2-293,

13 The Prince George's County Code

14 (2023 Edition, 2024 Supplement).

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
16 Maryland, that Section 2-293 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby
17 repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

18 SUBTITLE 2. ADMINISTRATION.

19 DIVISION 17. CODE OF ETHICS.

20 **Sec. 2-293. Prohibited conduct and interests.**

21 (a) Participation Prohibitions. Except as permitted by Board regulations or opinion, an

1 official or employee may not participate in:

2 (1) Any matter, except in the exercise of an administrative or ministerial duty which
 3 does not affect the disposition or decision with respect to that matter, if, to [his] their knowledge,
 4 [he] they, [his] their spouse, parent, child, brother, or sister has an interest therein.

5 * * * * *

6 (2) Post employment limitations and restrictions.

7 (A) With the exception of former members of the county Council, a former official or
 8 employee may not assist or represent any party other than the county for compensation in a case,
 9 contract, or other specific matter involving the county if that matter is one in which [he] they
 10 significantly participated as an official or employee. A specific matter may be one in which there
 11 is the same basic facts, related issues, and information, involving the same or related interest, as
 12 well as other considered factors.

13 (B) Until the conclusion of [one] three calendar years from the date the official leaves
 14 County office, a former member of the county council may not assist or represent another party
 15 for compensation in a matter that is the subject of legislative action.

16 (C) A former member of the County Council may not assist or represent another party for
 17 compensation in any judicial or quasi-judicial proceeding in which they substantially participated
 18 in or voted on as a member of the County Council.

19 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby
 20 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,
 21 sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of
 22 competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining
 23 words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this
 24 Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such
 25 invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,
 26 or section.

1 SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)
2 calendar days after it becomes law.
