<u>CR-74-2008 (DR-2) - A RESOLUTION CONCERNING FY 2002 – 2011 TEN YEAR</u>
<u>SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN</u> for the purpose of amending the Prince George's
County FY 2002 – 2011 Ten Year Solid Waste Management Plan by adding the Prince George's
County Western Branch Transfer Station located at 6550 SE Crain Highway, Upper Marlboro.

Council Resolution 79 amends Salary Schedule G to provide a cost of living increase of two and one-half percent (2.5%) retroactively effective the first full pay period in July 2008; modified health benefit premium costs; and other modified benefits for General Schedule employees. Council Resolution 79 was introduced by Council Member Dean. Council Member Exum moved to Suspend the Council Rules of Procedure to allow for the immediate adoption of Council Resolution 79; seconded by Council Member Knotts. The motion carried by voice vote. Council Member Exum moved adoption of Council Resolution 79; seconded by Council Member Bland. The motion carried 9-0.

CR-80-2008 – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING A SECTOR PLAN AMENDMENT AND A CONCURRENT SECTIONAL MAP AMENDMENT (SMA) FOR SUBREGION 4 for the purposes of initiating a replacement to the 1985 Suitland-District Heights and Vicinity Master Plan and Sectional Map Amendment and the 1993 Landover and Vicinity Master Plan and Sectional Map Amendment; and an amendment of the 2000 Addison Road Metro Sector Plan and Sectional Map Amendment, the 2006 Suitland Mixed Use Town Center Development Plan and Zoning Map Amendment, and portions of the 2004 Morgan Boulevard-Largo Town Center Sector Plan and Sectional Map Amendment, the 2005 Tuxedo Road/Arbor Street/Cheverly Metro Area Sector Plan and Sectional Map Amendment, and the 2002 Prince George's County Approved General Plan that will establish goals, policies and strategies to guide future growth and development of the Subregion 4 Area.

# - <u>INTRODUCED; RULES SUSPENDED; ADOPTED</u>

Council Resolution 80 concerns Preparation of a new Master Plan and Section Map Amendment (SMA) and approval of Goals, Concepts, Guidelines, and Public Participation Program for Subregion 4 (Planning areas 72, 75A, and 75B). Council Resolution 80 was introduced by Council Members Dean, Exum and Harrison. Council Member Exum moved to Suspend the Council Rules of Procedure to allow for the immediate adoption of Council Resolution 80; seconded by Council Member Bland. The motion carried by voice vote. Council Member Exum moved adoption of Council Resolution 80; seconded by Council Member Bland. The motion carried 9-0.

<u>CR-81-2008 – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING EMPLOYEE FURLOUGH PLAN</u> for the purpose of approving a Furlough Plan in order to reduce the compensation expenditures of the County because of an ascertained shortfall in revenue.

# - <u>INTRODUCED</u>; <u>RULES SUSPENDED</u>; <u>ADOPTED</u>

Council Resolution 81 establishes a Furlough Plan for County employees to offset the ascertained revenue shortfall during Fiscal Year 2009. Council Resolution 81 was introduced by Council Member Dean. Chairman Dean granted the following Union Representatives to address the Council regarding Council Resolution 81. Mr. Douglas Bartholomew, President Local #1619; Mr. Ismael 'Vince' Canales, President FOP Lodge 89; Mr. Arthur Emory, President PCEA; Mr. Glen Middleton, Director, AFSCME and Mr. Tom Colbert, Health and Human Services. Each speaker opposed Council Resolution 81. Council Member Bland moved to Suspend the Council Rules of Procedure to allow for the immediate adoption of Council Resolution 81; seconded by Council Member Exum. The motion carried by voice vote. Under discussion, Council Member Olson expressed a desire that other options be considered to help reduce the number of actual furlough days. Council Member Bland moved adoption of Council Resolution 81; seconded by Council Member Dernoga. The motion carried 9-0.
