(b) The purpose of	f the Coordinating Council is to address issues affecting the

administration of criminal justice in Prince George's County by identifying and solving any		
potential systemic problems and improving the quality of the criminal justice system.

7	(c) Presiding Officer.
8	(1) The Chair of the Coordinating Council is the Administrative Judge of the Circuit
9	Court for Prince George's County, or his/her designee.
10	(2) The Co-Vice Chairs are the County Executive and the Administrative Judge for
11	District 5 of the District Court of Maryland or their designees.
12	(d) Meetings and Quorum.
13	(1) The Coordinating Council shall meet at least quarterly each year.
14	(2) For a voting session of the Coordinating Council, a quorum is a majority of voting
15	members.
16	(e) Compensation and Limitation on Membership.
17	(1) A member of the Coordinating Council may not receive compensation for duties
18	performed as a member of the Coordinating Council.
19	(2) A member who holds membership by virtue of an elected or appointed position
20	holds membership on this Coordinating Council only during that member's term of office.
21	(f) Support Staff.
22	The Chief Administrative Officer of the County and the Court Administrator of the
23	Circuit Court shall designate support staff to the Coordinating Council from existing personnel,
24	and appropriations. Support staff shall be ex-officio members of the Coordinating Council.
25	Sec. 7-603. Same; duties and responsibilities.
26	The Coordinating Council shall:
27	(a) Provide a forum to facilitate communication among the Courts, public safety agencies
28	and health agencies in Prince George's County.
29	(b) Evaluate the existing organization and adequacy of law enforcement and administration
30	of justice in this County.

1	(c) Recommend a 3-year strategic plan for the long-range development of the County's
2	Criminal Justice System that provides solutions for identified problem areas and achieves
3	effective coordination of the public safety activities in the County. The Plan shall:
4	(1) Evaluate and recommend innovative ways to facilitate and expedite the
5	management of criminal cases in Prince George's County;
6	(2) Evaluate and recommend information technology for the Courts, public safety
7	agencies and health agencies in Prince George's County; and
8	(3) Evaluate and recommend other systemic changes in the Prince George's County
9	Criminal Justice System.
10	(d) Review programs proposed by law enforcement, public safety agencies and health
11	agencies for:
12	(1) Compatibility with the 3-year strategic plan;
13	(2) Compatibility with the County's approved operating budget; and
14	(3) Impact on the other public safety agencies, health agencies and the Courts.
15	(e) Recommend programs that will educate the community about law enforcement, crime
16	prevention, and other criminal justice issues and will promote respect for the law, and encourage
17	community involvement in law enforcement and other appropriate public safety agencies, health
18	agencies and the Courts.
19	(f) Facilitate coordination of the programs and activities among the County law
20	enforcement, public safety agencies, health agencies and the Courts.
21	(g) Facilitate coordination of County law enforcement, public safety agencies, health
22	agencies and the Courts with those of the State of Maryland and neighboring State and local
23	governments.
24	(h) Promote efficient processing of criminal cases at every stage from arrest to completion
25	of trial and correctional programs.
26	(i) Carry out other activities to achieve fair and effective law enforcement, crime
27	prevention, and justice.
28	Sec. 7-604. Same; information and assistance.
29	The agencies of the State and County government and the Courts who are members of the
30	Coordinating Council shall provide the Coordinating Council any information and assistance, not
31	inconsistent with law, that the Coordinating Council requests.

## 1 Sec. 7-605. Same; reports and recommendation (a) The Coordinating Council shall make semi-annual reports and recommendations to the 2 County Executive, the County Council, and the Judiciary. 3 (b) The County Executive, the County Council, and the Judiciary may refer matters to the 4 5 Coordinating Council and the Council shall file a written report with the requesting entity. SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) 6 7 calendar days after it becomes law. Adopted this 30th day of November, 2004.
