A closer look at scams targeting the senior community and strategies to combat them



How risky is the scam?

- BBB uses a *risk index* to help understand which scams pose the highest risk
- The risk index focuses on 3 factors:
 - Exposure (volume of reports, how common is this scam?)
 - Susceptibility (did the scam target fall victim to the scam? Losing money or personal data?)
 - Monetary Loss (How much money was lost to the scam?)




Are seniors more at risk of being scammed?


Short answer? - NO



Are seniors more exposed to scams? - NO

 Exposure: In 2020, only about 11% of all scams reported to BBB Scam Tracker were submitted by seniors.









Susceptibility: was money lost?

Seniors were the least likely to fall victim to a scam in 2020 consistent with the previous year.

So what does this mean?

 It doesn't mean that scams are no longer a threat - it just means we can take a closer look at the types of scams seniors report VS the scams they actually lose money to.







Do seniors lose more money to scams?

Based on Scam Tracker data, NO

- Monetary Loss: (median \$ Lost
- Seniors reported losing the same amount of money as consumers aged 18-24
- Seniors reported losing less money than consumers aged 45-54







Will these trends continue throughout 2021?

We will need more data to determine this since we are only half - way through the year.

BUT - We can take a closer look at the types of scams that are impacting seniors the most

Risk Index Recap


- Riskiest scams for seniors in 2021 based on:
 - Exposure: online purchase scams
 - Susceptibility: moving scams
 - Monetary loss: phishing





Online Purchase Scams

- Beware of business impostors
- Look for active contact information
- Research unfamiliar businesses
- Pay with a credit card
- Beware of red flags:
 - o grammar and spelling mistakes
 - o odd URLs
 - extremely low prices
 - URL begins with http:// instead of https://





Tip: Product photos can be easily faked



Moving Scams

- Do a careful and extensive search for a trustworthy mover
- Get an in -person or virtual estimate
- Avoid large upfront fees and cash demands
- Estimate should be by weight, not cubic feet
- Get everything in writing





Phishing

- Never click links or download attachments from unknown senders
- Be skeptical of unsolicited contact
- Beware of generic messages
- Never give out personal information by phone or email
- Check the email address of the sender





Impact of BBB
