For the purpo	se of creating a Stormwater Pond Task Force to study stormwater pond issues and			
determine the	status of all stormwater ponds that are not under the management of the County and

WHERE	AS, the duties of the Stormwater Pond Task Force include:			
1. Identify the current stormwater pond infrastructure for the stormwater por				
(currently operated or maintained by Homeowners Associations, Common			
•	Ownership Communities, and similar entities.			
2.	Determine what operation and maintenance entails for the infrastructure of the			
:	stormwater ponds.			
3.	Determine the capacity for the Homeowners Associations to operate and maintain			
1	the stormwater ponds, and where capacity is lacking, identify alternative solutions to			
(operations and maintenance to include a program of transfer of responsibilities to the			
•	County.			
4.	Identify alternative ownership solutions for the stormwater ponds.			
5.	5. Identify funding sources for the operations and maintenance of stormwater po			
j	infrastructure.			
WHERE	AS, the County Council desires to establish the Stormwater Ponds Task Force for			
Prince George	e's County; and			

WHEREAS, Section 506 of the Charter provides that the County Council may appoint, for

designated periods, one or more temporary advisory boards of citizens of the County who shall assist in the consideration of County policies and programs;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that there is hereby created a task force to study stormwater pond issues to determine the status of all stormwater ponds that are not under the management of the County and the actions that should be taken to address infrastructure concerns within eight months after the effective date of this Resolution;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Stormwater Pond Task Force will be comprised of:

- 1. Five (5) Members of the Homeowners Associations and residential communities County wide that operate a stormwater pond.
- 2. Member appointed by the Prince George's County Delegation.
- 3. Member shall be a Prince George's County-Based Professional Engineer.
- 4. Two (2) Members of the County Council whose District is heavily impacted by stormwater ponds controlled by a Homeowners Association or community groups.
- 5. Member from the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission.
- 6. Member from the Department of the Environment.
- 7. Member from the Department of Public Works and Transportation.
- 8. Member from the Soil Conservation District.
- 9. Member from the Department of Permitting, Inspections and Enforcement.
- 10. Member from the Commission on Common Ownership Communities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that:

- 1. Each member shall serve until the Stormwater Pond Task Force completes its work and submits their study to the County Council.
- 2. The Stormwater Pond Task Force shall determine the frequency of the meetings and will be led by a chair elected by the members.
- 3. The Stormwater Pond Task Force shall submit a written study to the County Council within eight months after the effective date of this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Stormwater Pond Task Force will develop a study that outlines the following information:

1. Strategies and recommendations on management of stormwater ponds owned by Homeowners Associations or community members.

- 3. An analysis of how stormwater pond operations and maintenance shall be funded, to include the funding responsibilities of the current responsible party, including the developer community.
- 4. The scope of the infrastructure and an analysis of the cost to operate and maintain the stormwater pond.
