RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

Use of Deadly Force

For the purpose of providing that the Chief of Police and the State's Attorney cooperate to provide for the prompt investigation of each incident when deadly force is used by a police officer.

WHEREAS, the use of deadly force by police officers results in numerous deaths and injuries to persons suspected of committing crimes in the County; and

WHEREAS, the State's Attorney is charged with the responsibility of investigating the use of deadly force by police officers to determine whether the use of such force was justified; and

WHEREAS, the State's Attorney is responsible for prosecuting persons using deadly force without justification in accordance with the applicable criminal statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the State's Attorney is not able to evaluate whether the use of deadly force is justified by the circumstances of the incident unless an independent investigation of the incident scene is made prior to the removal or disposal of evidence by the investigating police officers; and

WHEREAS, an independent investigation by the State's Attorney of the use of deadly force by police officers in addition to the investigation conducted by the Police Department increases public confidence in the actions of police officers; and

WHEREAS, an independent investigation by the State's Attorney is necessary for the State's Attorney to discharge his statutory and constitutional obligations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Chief of Police, in cooperation with the State's Attorney, is
