of the report's recommendations through Resolution #12-1558; and	
WHEREAS	, the Councils jointly endorsed in concept the January 1994 Working Group
Report spending affordability process; and	
WHEREAS	s, both Councils endorsed the utilization of the spending affordability process
beginning with the formulation of the Fiscal Year 1996 budget; and	
WHEREAS, the Spending Affordability Working Group, consisting of the staffs of the	
Montgomery and Prince George's County Councils and both County Executive's offices, make	
certain recommendations on the WSSC Fiscal Year 2022 Operating and Capital Budgets; and	
WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council and the Montgomery County Council
