Overview of Prince George's County Memorial Library System

History

In 1902, the <u>State Library Commission</u> was authorized to develop public libraries throughout Maryland. The County Commissioners allocated funds to establish the <u>Prince George's County Memorial Library System</u> (PGCMLS) in 1946 as "a living memorial to those... who served in wars" under a law enacted by the State legislature. The Laurel Branch was the first library to become part of the System.

In 2024, PGCMLS operates <u>19 regional branches</u>, a 24/7 online library, and pop-up services throughout the County. The Library System also provides service at the County Correctional Center. PGCMLS has been fine-free since June 2020.

Leadership

PGCMLS is governed by a 7-member volunteer <u>Board of Library Trustees</u>, which is appointed by the County Executive and approved by the County Council. This body serves as the policy-making body that guides the development of library services. The <u>PGCMLS Foundation</u> provides critical philanthropic support to the Library.

Programs

This section provides a breakdown of non-branch-specific Library programs. PGCMLS divides the programs into four (4) general categories: 1) Books from Birth, 2) Summer Reading Program, 3) Branch Programming, and 4) PR Special Programs.

In 2023 (calendar year), the Library hosted 5,541 programs with 119,471 participants.




Books From Birth

FY 2023 funding: \$315,000 – 80% of Public Services and Program budget.

The Library's *Ready to Read: Books from Birth Program*, the primary programmatic expense of the System, was officially rolled out during FY 2019 as part of the County's Newborn Initiative. The program enables children to develop a home library of 60 books by the time they reach kindergarten and encourages parents to read with and to their children. In FY 2023, enrollment totaled 18,173, with 163,010 books distributed. The Library continues to express concern over the long-term affordability of the Program as enrollment continues to exceed budget every year since FY 2022.

The table below shows the total enrollment and the number of books distributed per fiscal year. While the COVID-19 pandemic affected in-person programming and activities, enrollment in the program did not have the typical slump in fiscal 2021 that most other data points in this report show.²



Summer Reading Program

FY 2023 funding: \$25,000 – 6.4% of Public Services and Program budget.

² Note: 2024 YTD in this and all subsequent graphs refer to data up to February 15, 2024. All years refer to fiscal years rather than calendar years.

The Summer Reading Program, in collaboration with the Washington Nationals, called "Summer Prince George's," engages customers of all ages in library activities, such as borrowing materials, attending events, and reading. The funds cover hiring local educational performers and presenters for all branches and purchasing supplies.

Hired presenters in 2023 include:

The budget line also funds purchasing incentives such as tee shirts, tote bags, and books. The Washington Nationals provide tickets to home baseball games.

Branch Programming

FY 2023 funding: \$42,100 – 10.8% of Public Services and Program budget.

Branch programming budgets support presenters and performers, as well as materials and supplies for each area and branch to use at their discretion and need. The organizations hired are vetted and serve the needs of those local branch communities. The Outreach and Partnerships Specialists helped to coordinate 660 collaborative programs in calendar year 2023 across the library system.

This line item supports the work of the heritage teams by funding paid presenters who have particular cultural, historical, artistic, and academic expertise to best represent diverse perspectives and provide rich context and content. These initiatives include Hispanic Heritage, Black Culture, Asian Pacific American Heritage, Native and Indigenous Culture, LGBTQ+, and the variety of intersectionality therein. These funds also support programs on health and wellness, spoken word and poetry, author visits, and many more. \$22,000 of the \$42,100 from this budget in FY 2023 was used in support of these programs.

In FY 2023, Area Directors were allocated \$20,000 of the \$42,100 Branch Programming budget to use at their discretion to support branch-level programming. This equal distribution of programming supply funds, starting in FY 2022, helped to address long-standing inequities between branches with Friends of the Library groups that provided financial support and those without. It empowers branch-level staff to develop and deliver programs that meet the specific needs and interests of their communities. In FY 2023, this worked out to \$1,000 per branch, including the County Correctional Center's law library. These funds are used to support programs and outreach efforts to customers of all ages. Examples of items purchased by the branches include craft supplies, STEM supplies, board games, film licenses, 3D printing filaments, puppets, and ukulele kits.

Public Relations Special Programs and Events

FY 2023 funding: \$11,000 – 11.82% of Public Relations and Program budget.

The Public Relations Special Programs and Events budget supports major system-wide initiatives and one-time events such as branch grand openings. Many of these are in support of the initiatives outlined in branch programming. In FY2023, special programs and events included a Festival of Cultures, Pride events including a Rainbow Festival, Asian Pacific American Heritage programs, and For All the People: A Century of Citizen Action in Health Care Reform/Para todo el pueblo: Un siglo de acción ciudadana en la reforma de la atención de la salud, an English- and Spanish-language, 12-banner exhibition from the National Library of Medicine. The budget is also used for supplies, printing and marketing, and ASL interpreting for events and programs.




Library Branches


The Memorial Library System manages 19 branches and the County Correctional Center's law library. The branches are divided into four geographic regions, each overseen by an Area Director.

By Total Library visitors, the chart below shows that total visitors decreased at the height of the COVID-19 pandemic and are now beginning to rebound to pre-pandemic levels.




Visitors to all Library branches follow a similar pattern of decrease in 2021 as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic branch closures and subsequent increase as restrictions began to ease. The brown line showing a sharp spike since 2021 is the Hyattsville Branch Library.³




Contrary to in-person visits, the chart below shows that active cardholders⁴, and cardholders as a percentage of the population were highest in fiscal year 2021. This may point to increased use of online resources as people spent more time at home during the pandemic.




The total number of Library-sponsored events and programs has been trending upward since fiscal year 2021, with children's programming being the most popular demographic group. Teen programs are the least common type of programming available at all branches except the Bowie Branch Library.




The chart below shows the total online and in-person attendance for events and programs, broken down by demographic group. The sharp increase in adult programs in fiscal year 2021 was due to the popularity of an online conversation by author Ibram X. Kendi.



All branches are required to provide weekly "Ready 2 Read" story times. Each branch should also offer regular programs for elementary students (ages 5-12). This should include *at least* one STEM and one Literacy program per month. Programs for teens are expected to be offered at branches with a significant number of teen customers. We are currently working towards expanding this expectation to all branches to better serve our teen community. Adult programming is offered at each branch with the needs and interests of this population in mind.

Attendance at Online Programs follows a similar trend as all programs and events. The sharp increase in FY 2021 is due to the conversation mentioned above.




Material circulation of all Library resources declined in 2021 as a result of the COVID-19 closing and has begun to rebound to pre-pandemic levels. Data on the chart below includes the total circulation for all branches as well as the Digital Library, a collection of electronic, online, digital checkouts from e-resources.
