12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
13 Maryland, sitting as the District Council for that part of the Maryland-Washington Regional
14 District in Prince George's County, Maryland, that Section 27-473(b) of the Zoning Ordinance of
15 Prince George's County, Maryland, being also Subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code,
16 be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

SUBTITLE 27. ZONING.

PART 7. INDUSTRIAL ZONES.

DIVISION 3. USES PERMITTED.

Sec. 27-473. Uses permitted.

- 38 A Special Exception is required for land [which is ten (10) acres or greater in size and] located within 300 feet of any residentially-zoned land and land owned by Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority.**

1 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Ordinance shall take effect forty-five
2 (45) calendar days after its adoption.
