Melvin C. High

Pursuant to proper notice, the public hearing convened on the appointment of Mr. Melvin C. High as Chief of Police for Prince George's County. County Executive Jack Johnson introduced the nominee and spoke to his credential and character. Mr. Leonard Cooke, Ms. Kim Dyne, Dr. Rodwell M. Cato, Mr. George C. Crawley, Commissioner Murphy and Ms. Victoria Brock spoke in support of Mr. High's nomination. Mr. High was present and spoke on his own behalf. All person wishing to speak having done so, the public hearing was declared held. Council Member Dean moved confirmation of Mr. Melvin C. High as Chief of Police for Prince George's County; seconded by Council Member Harrington; carried by roll call vote 8-0 (Absent: Council Member Hendershot).

<u>CB-23-2003 – AN ACT CONCERNING COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT – PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY POLICE CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION</u> for the purpose of amending the labor agreement by and between Prince George's County, Maryland and the Prince George's County Police Civilian Employees Association to provide for wage and certain other terms and conditions of employment for personnel classifications certified by the Prince George's County Public Employee Relations Board AAA Case No. 16390 00248 01. - *PRESENTED*

Council Bill 23 was presented by the Chairman at the request of the County Executive and referred to the Public Safety and Fiscal Management Committee.

<u>CB-24-2003 – AN ACT CONCERNING THE CLASSIFICATION PLAN FOR PRINCE</u> <u>GEORGE'S COUNTY</u> for the purpose of assigning certain existing classes of work to the bargaining unit represented by the Police Civilian Employees Association (PCEA). - <u>PRESENTED</u>

Council Bill 23 was presented by the Chairman at the request of the County Executive and referred to the Public Safety and Fiscal Management Committee.

<u>CB-25-2003 – AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING L-A-C ZONE</u> for the purpose of exempting certain dwelling units in proximity to the Metro Station from certain site and building design guidelines and regulations, and limitations on the number of townhouses and multifamily dwellings in the L-A-C Zone. - <u>PRESENTED</u>

Council Bill 25 was presented by Council Member Harrington and referred to the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee.

CR-18-2003 – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING A SUPPLEMENTARY

APPROPRIATION OF FEDERAL, STATE AND OTHER FUNDS for the purpose of funding from grants in the amount of \$4,738,345 to the Health Department, Department of Social Services, Office of the State's Attorney, Department of Corrections, Department of Family Services, Police Department, Fire Department, Office of the Sheriff, Department of Environmental Resources and Office of Personnel and Labor Relations. INTRODUCED

Council Resolution 18 provides for supplementary appropriations in the amount of \$4,738,345 to support grant programs for new or expanded efforts of ten (10) agencies. Council Member Knotts moved enactment of Council Bill 21; seconded by Council Member Harrington; carried by roll call vote 8-0 (Absent: Council Member Hendershot)

<u>CR-14-2003 (DR-2) – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY</u> <u>ENTERPRISE ZONE</u> for the purpose of endorsing the proposed expansion to the Prince George's County Enterprise Zone. - <u>DRAFT 2 SUBSTITUTED</u>; <u>ADOPTED</u>

Mr. Craig S. Price, Deputy Council Administrator, provided a verbal report of the actions and recommendations of the Committee of the Whole. Council Resolution 14 was favorably reported out of C.O.W. on 4/8/2003 with amendments. Council Member Exum moved to substitute Draft 2 in lieu of Draft 1; seconded by Council Member Peters; carried by voice vote. Vice Chairman Knotts moved adoption; seconded by Council Member Dean; carried by roll call vote 8-0 (Absent: Council Member Hendershot).
