RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

Gateway Roads

For the purpose of designating certain roads within the County as Gateway Roads.

WHEREAS, mobile vendors are permitted to sell certain goods in the right-of-way of a public road, under certain conditions, in accordance with Section 5-193.01 of the Prince George's County Code; and

WHEREAS, Section 5-193.01 applies to all roads, regardless of their classification, usage, maximum speed limit, or significance as a gateway to the County or its major employment destinations; and

WHEREAS, certain arterials exist that carry high volumes of traffic at high speeds into and through the County; and

WHEREAS, certain roadways, commonly referred to as service roads, exist that carry high volumes of traffic at varying rates of speed; and

WHEREAS, the frequent and sudden stopping on the rights-of-way of these roads disrupts the flow of traffic and poses a safety hazard to the motorists on the roadway, as well as to the persons conducting business with a roadway vendor; and

WHEREAS, activities associated with mobile vendors tend to generate litter and other accumulations of trash and garbage; and

WHEREAS, certain arterial and service roadways are significant gateways into the County centers of business and Federal, State and local governmental activities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's

County, Maryland, that the following roads shall be designated Gateway Roads: Maryland Routes 4, 5, 214, 210 and its service roadway, 202, and 3/301. The portion of Maryland Route 202 between the Capital Beltway and Lake Arbor Way/Arena Drive shall not be considered a Gateway Road for the purpose of prohibiting mobile vendors until a permit for the widening of the road to six lanes has been issued by the State Highway Administration.
