WHEREAS	S, Prince George's County currently does not have a Criminal Justice	
Coordination Co	uncil; and	
WHEREAS	S, establishment of such a Criminal Justice Coordination Council would greatly	
benefit the Prince George's Public Safety Agencies in its continued fight against crime; and		
WHEREAS	S, such Criminal Justice Coordination Council will be an asset that is long	
overdue in Princ	e George's County; and	
WHEREAS	S, pursuant to Section 402 of the County Charter, the County Executive has	
authority to appoint the members of all boards and commissions.
