**REPORT:** Favorable 4-0: Council Members Burroughs, Ivey, Streeter, and Turner. Absent: Franklin

The Prince George's County Council's Government Operations and Fiscal Policy Committee convened on June 23, 2022, to consider appointments to the Human Rights Commission. The Human Rights Commission works to eliminate discriminatory practices through advocacy, education, mediation and investigation of complaints, and the enforcement of discrimination laws. Brindisi Chan, a resident of Laurel, Maryland, is a new appointee. Ms. Chan is a Public Affairs Specialist with the Federal Emergency Management Agency. She received her Bachelor of Arts degree from Harvard University.

Those being reappointed are Wendi Howard, a resident of Bowie; Sylvia Johnson, a resident of Bowie; Ademola Oduyebo, a resident of Capitol Heights; Charlene Proctor, a resident of Upper Marlboro; and Joseph Reed, a resident of Fort Washington. Ms. Proctor serves as Chair of the Commission.

Miriam Brewer, Appointments Liaison, Office of the County Executive, introduced the nominees, and each nominee was given the opportunity to speak.

After discussion, the Government Operation and Fiscal Policy Committee reported the nominees out favorably, 4-0.
