(A) a firefighter, an emergency medical technician, a correctional officer, a police officer, public safety dispatcher, or a deputy sheriff employed full-time by a public safety agency [in]<u>of</u> Prince George's County <u>Government</u>; or

(B) a volunteer firefighter or volunteer emergency medical technician for the Prince George's County Fire/EMS Department who is eligible under the length of service award program.

(C) a public safety officer employed full-time, predominantly, in Prince George's County by a bi-county agency, which includes Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (MNCPPC), Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (WSSC), and Washington Suburban Transit Commission (WSTC).

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
