Committee Vote: Favorable, 3-0, (In favor: Councilmembers Wilson, Maloney and Scott).

This bill will declare certain parcels of property located in Collington Center as surplus and approve the County Executive's plan for disposal of such parcels. The parcels, Lot 11 Block C and parts of Lots 7, 8 and 15 of Block C, Collington Center, are under contract to Distribution Plus, Inc., (DPI). DPI plans to consolidate their offices and regional distribution center in the County. In order to meet their construction schedule, DPI would like to go to settlement on this property during the summer, which is earlier than anticipated when the contract was signed.

The sale of this real property will generate revenue of \$2,745,965, place the property on the County's tax rolls and attract approximately 200 new jobs.

There are approximately 7 parcels remaining at Collington Center.

The fiscal impact on the County will be positive as a result of enacting CB-64-2000.
