CR-63-2009 – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING SCHOOL FACILITIES

Council Member Dernoga, Chair of the Transportation, Housing and the Environment (THE) Committee, provided a verbal report of the actions and recommendations from the Committee to the Council. Council Resolution 46 was introduced by Council Members Bland and Campos on 7/7/2009. The Public Hearing was held on 9/9/2009. On 9/24/2009 Council Resolution 46 was favorably reported out of the Transportation, Housing and the Environment (THE) Committee with amendments. Council Member Dernoga moved to substitute (DR-2) in lieu of (DR-1); seconded by Council Member Harrison. The motion carried by voice vote. Council Member Dernoga moved adoption of Council Resolution 46 (DR-2) as amended; seconded by Council Member Harrison. The motion carried 9-0.

CR-52-2009 – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE 2008 WATER AND SEWER PLAN (APRIL 2009 CYCLE OF AMENDMENTS) for the purpose of changing the water and sewer category designations of properties within the 2008 Water and Sewer Plan.

<u>CB-45-2009 – AN ACT CONCERNING CONSUMPTION AND POSSESSION OF</u>
<u>ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN PUBLIC</u> for the purpose of amending provisions of the County Code to revise the penalty for the consumption and possession of alcoholic beverages.

<u>CB-46-2009 – AN ACT CONCERNING ELECTRICAL CODE</u> for the purpose of amending the Prince George's County Electrical Code, adopting certain amendments to the 2008 Edition of the National Electrical Code and amending certain sections as it relates to building standards. - <u>PRESENTED</u>

Council Bill 46 was presented by the Chairperson at the request of the County Executive and referred to the Transportation, Housing and the Environment (THE) Committee.

<u>CB-47-2009 – AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING O-S ZONE</u> for the purpose of amending the net lot area for certain one-family detached dwellings in the O-S Zone. - *PRESENTED*

Council Bill 47 was presented by Council Member Dernoga and referred to the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development (PZED) Committee.

<u>CB-48-2009 – AN ACT CONCERNING TAXICABS AND LIMOUSINES</u> for the purpose of amending provisions of the Code regulating taxicabs, amending certain definitions and requirements for certificates of registration, increasing rates and otherwise relating to the regulation of taxicabs. - <u>PRESENTED</u>
