CB-14-2006 – AN ACT CONCERNING THE AUTHORIZATION, ISSUANCE AND DELIVERY OF SPECIAL OBLIGATION BONDS for the purpose of providing that special obligation bonds may be issued under the provisions of this Act, in an amount equal to the aggregate principal amount of Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000) for the County to finance or reimburse additional costs of the convention center; making certain findings and determinations, among others, concerning the public benefit and purpose of such special obligation bonds; providing that such special obligation bonds authorized to be issued hereby shall be payable, on a subordinate basis with respect to the special obligations bonds previously issued by the County as more specifically provided for in this Act, from the amounts levied and deposited in the Tax Increment Fund including the Hotel Tax and from the Special Hotel Rental Tax and that the special obligation bonds shall not constitute a general obligation debt of the County or a pledge of the County's full faith and credit for taxing power other than the County's pledge, on a subordinate basis, of the taxes representing the levy on the Tax Increment, the Hotel Tax and the Special Hotel Rental Tax; authorizing the County Executive to take certain actions, to execute documents and make certain commitments on behalf of the County in connection with the issuance and delivery of such special obligation bonds; authorizing the execution and delivery of such special obligation bonds and such other documents as may be necessary and desirable to effectuate the financing or reimbursement of a portion of the costs of the convention center and the issuance and delivery of such special obligation bonds; and generally providing for, and determining various matters in connection with, the issuance, delivery and payment of such special obligation bonds.
