Committee Report

Committee Vote: Favorable, as amended, 6-1 (In favor: Council Members

Wineland, Castaldi, Casula, Del Giudice, Fletcher and

MacKinnon; Opposed: Council Member Mills)

Carol Brown representing the Department of Aging and Mike Knapp representing the Office of Personnel were present for the worksession. CB-70-1991 will provide persons in limited term status positions with experience in governmental affairs. It will also allow for positions under this category which are created exclusively for use as part of an established program for the employment of senior citizens or persons with disabilities, students, trainees, interns and similarly situated persons.

With the adoption of CB-70-1991 the one year limitation on internship

programs (a limited term status position) is deleted.

An employee which is appointed to a limited term status position would be appointed for a period of time designated by the appropriate program. The employee will also be entitled to those benefits available as specified in the appropriate program.

The Office of Law has reviewed the legislation and found it to be in proper legislative form. The Office of Labor Relations and the Office of Management and Budget also support the legislation.

The Committee discussed the concerns of the Legislative Officer as explained in his memo and voted in favor of his suggested amendments which provided some clarity as to how the terms and conditions of the positions are to be established.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT (Includes reason for proposal, as well as any unique statutory requirements)

Adoption of these amendments will (1) provide the Department of Aging with the necessary flexibility to administer and satisfy the programmatic goals of the National Council of Senior Citizens Senior Aides Project and (2) facilitate the administration of employment, training, and similar programs established pursuant to Section 16-106(b) (9.1) of the Personnel Law.
