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BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT (Includes reason for proposal, as well as any unique statutory requirements)

Currently under Section 24-107 of the Subdivision Regulations, properties which are partially located within the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area cannot be divided by deed without approval of a subdivision plat for the entire tract of land. This provision works as a disincentive in circumstances where a property owner wants solely to convey a portion of his property which lies in the Critical Area to a public agency for purposes such as parkland. The proposed legislation permits property owners to

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convey property in the Critical Area to public agencies without having to file preliminary and final plats of subdivision.
