This bill adopts the collective bargaining agreement of the Prince George's Correctional Officers' Association covering the new bargaining unit of Food Service employee in the Department of Corrections. These employees were previously non-union employees whose salary and benefits were provided under the General Schedule salary schedule. There are five employees covered by this agreement.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT (Includes reason for proposal, as well as any unique statutory requirements)

Prince George's County and the Prince George's Correctional Officers' Association, Inc. (PGCOA) have completed labor negotiations on a new eighteen (18) month labor agreement through June 30, 1992 which covers a new bargaining unit of Food Services employees in the Department of Corrections. This bill is to adopt and approve the collective bargaining agreement in accordance with Section 16-233 (f) of the Personnel Law. The fiscal impact of this Agreement will be provided by the Office of Management and Budget.
