For the purpose of	of condemning all forms of anti-Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI)	
sentiment, racism, and discrimination, and a call on federal officials, in collaboration with state		
and local agencie	es and Asian American and Pacific Islander community organizations, to address	
the rise in COVI	D-19-related hate crimes.	
WHEREAS	, May is Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month; and	
WHEREAS	, roughly 43,000 residents of Asian American and Pacific Islander descent	
account for 4.6%	of Prince George's County's population; and	
WHEREAS	, Prince George's County firmly believes its strength lies in its diversity and	
rich culture of its	residents; and	
WHEREAS	, the use of anti-Asian rhetoric across the country, stemming from classifying	
COVID-19 by a geographic location or linking it to a specific group of people, has increased		
stigma, harassme	ent, assault, racism, xenophobia, discrimination, and scapegoating of our Asian	
American popula	ation; and	
WHEREAS	, we recognize African Americans and Latinos have a shared history with Asian	
Americans of dis	crimination starting from the Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882 and the repeal in	
1943 and still too	lay we see very minimum representation of Asian elected officials including in	
the State of Mary	yland, which only has 10 elected officials of Asian descent.	
NOW, THE	EREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's	

County, Maryland, that the County Council condemns all forms of anti-Asian and Pacific

Islander sentiment and recognizes the health and safety of all people, regardless of background, must be of the utmost priority.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council calls on federal law enforcement officials, working with state and local agencies to

- 1. expeditiously investigate and document all credible reports of hate crimes, harassment, bullying, and threats against AAPI communities;
- 2. expand data collection and reporting to document the rise in incidences of hate crimes relating to COVID–19; and
- 3. hold the perpetrators of those crimes, incidents, or threats accountable and bring such perpetrators to justice.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council calls on the State's Attorney to work with state and local agencies and AAPI community-based organizations to prevent discrimination and expand culturally appropriate education campaigns on public reporting of hate crimes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council calls on the Secretary of Health and Human Services, in coordination with the COVID–19 Health Equity Task Force and AAPI community-based organizations, to issue guidance to mitigate racially discriminatory language in describing the COVID–19 pandemic.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council calls upon the United States to recommit to serve as a model in building a more inclusive, diverse, and tolerant society.
