BILL

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Clean Corridors and Rapid Response Act of 2026

3 For the purpose of creating a Clean Corridors and Rapid Response Program for expedited
4 removal of illegal dumping and litter in designated areas; providing for the designation of Clean
5 Corridors by Council resolution; and generally relating to removal of debris and litter from
6 sidewalks and debris from roadways.

7 BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

8 SUBTITLE 23. ROADS AND SIDEWALKS.

9 Section 23-153

10 The Prince George's County Code

11 (2023 Edition; 2025 Supplement).

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
13 Maryland, that Section 23-153 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby
14 repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

15 SUBTITLE 23. ROADS AND SIDEWALKS.

16 DIVISION 4. REQUIRED REMOVAL OF SNOW, ICE, WEEDS, LITTER, AND
17 DEBRIS FROM SIDEWALKS AND DEBRIS FROM ROADWAYS.

18 **Sec. 23-153 [Reserved.] Clean Corridors and Rapid Response Program.**

19 (a) Clean Corridors and Rapid Response Program established. The Department of Public
20 Works and Transportation shall operate a program for the purpose of targeting designated high-
21 visibility and high-traffic areas for rapid clean-up.

1 (b) Designation of Clean Corridors. The Council may designate, either on its own initiative
2 or at the request of the County Executive, certain areas as Clean Corridors for a specified time
3 period for action under this Section.

4 (c) Program requirements. In areas designated as Clean Corridors, the Department of
5 Public Works and Transportation shall:

6 (1) remove all illegal dumping, litter, and other debris from the designated area
7 within 48 hours of the adoption of the designation resolution;

8 (2) remove any illegal dumping, litter, and other debris reported in the designated
9 area within 48 hours of receiving the report for the time period specified in the designation
10 resolution;

11 (3) engage in proactive dumping, litter, and debris removal in the designated area not
12 less than weekly for the time period specified in the designation resolution;

13 (4) identify and implement beautification measures in the designated area; and

14 (5) identify illegal dumping and litter prevention strategies, including enforcement
15 actions, for the designated area.

16 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby
17 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,
18 sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of
19 competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining
20 words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this
21 Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such
22 invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,
23 or section.

24 SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)
25 calendar days after it becomes law.
