SECTION 1. BE	IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
Maryland, that the foll	owing amendment to Section 307A of the Charter of Prince George's
County, Maryland, is h	nereby proposed:
Section 307A. Term	Limitation.
No person shall b	e eligible to serve more than two consecutive terms on the County
Council. No person sh	nall be eligible to serve more than two consecutive terms as County
Executive. This Section shall apply to all persons who are currently serving on the County	
Council or as County I	Executive on the effective date of this Section and to all persons elected
thereafter. <u>In the even</u>	t that a charter amendment adding two at-large Council members is
ratified by a majority of	of the qualified voters of the County at the general election in November,
2004, then no Council	member who has been elected to two consecutive terms of office, either as
an at-large member or	as a district member, or both, shall be eligible to be elected to a third

1 consecutive term on the Council. If, at the general election in November 2, 2004, the qualified 2 voters of the County shall not ratify an amendment to this Charter adding two at-large Council 3 member positions, then this amendment shall be automatically abrogated and of no effect and 4 shall be deleted from the text of the Charter. 5 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that a copy of this Act be transmitted to the 6 County Executive for publication and that a copy also be transmitted to the Board of Supervisors 7 of Elections for submission of the proposed amendment to the voters of this County at the 2004 8 General Election pursuant to Section 1105 of the Charter. 9 SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the question of adoption of this proposed Charter Amendment shall be submitted to the voters of the County at the General Election 10 11 occurring on November 2, 2004, and shall be placed on the ballot in the following form: 12 PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT 13 14 To provide that members of the County Council may not be elected to more than two 15 consecutive terms; and to provide a precedence clause in the event of conflicting charter 16 amendments ratified by the voters at the November 2004 general election. 17 18 SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that in the event that no petition for Charter 19 Amendment or for referendum hereafter meets all requirements of law and, therefore, is not 20 placed on the November 2004 ballot, then this Charter Amendment shall not appear on the local 21 ballot. 22 Adopted this 30th day of July, 2004, by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of 23 the full County Council.
