WHEREAS	youth and young adults from low-income households have disproportionately			
higher obstacles to	their success due to poverty, youth crime, and generally more limited access			
to resources and in	nformation;			
WHEREAS	youth and young adults from low-income households would particularly			
benefit from early exposure to employment opportunities to assist in economically sustaining				

their households and placing them on successful career pathways;

1	WHEREAS improving socioeconomic outcomes for youth and young adults from low-
2	income households would improve the overall quality of life for all Prince Georgians, now,

4	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
5	Maryland, that Section 2-504.01 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby

10	Sec. 2-504.01. Year-round employment program for underserved youth.
11	(a) In this section, <u>Underserved Youth</u> shall have the meaning prescribed in Section 2-
12	<u>503.01.</u>
13	(b) Year-Round Employment Program for Underserved Youth. Beginning in Fiscal Year
14	2027, subject to the allocation of funding, the Director of the Office of Human Resources
15	Management or other designee of the County Executive shall implement and administer a youth
16	employment program to provide employment positions solely for underserved youth throughout
17	the calendar year. The program may include, but is not limited to including, the following:
18	(1) Employment within County agencies;
19	(2) Employment in partnership with private sector entities, including but not limited to
20	including, businesses and non-profit organizations;
21	(3) Employment in partnership with government and quasi-government agencies and
22	organizations outside of County government;
23	(4) Enrichment, employment and entrepreneurship training, and any other program
24	elements as determined by the Director of the Office of Human Resources Management or other
25	designee of the County Executive; and
26	(5) Age and other program parameters as determined by the Director of the Office of
27	Human Resources Management or other designee of the County Executive.
28	SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that Section 10-306 of the Prince George's
29	County Code be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted with amendment:

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## SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION. DIVISION 21. YOUTH JOBS FUND

## Sec. 10-306. Youth Jobs Fund.

- (a) There is established as a nonlapsing fund, the Youth Jobs Fund, managed by the Director of the Office of Human Resources Management or other designee of the County Executive. All funds deposited or allocated to the Youth Jobs Fund, and any interest earned on those funds, shall not revert to the unrestricted fund balance of the General Fund of Prince George's County at the end of a fiscal year, or at any other time, but shall be continually available for the uses and purposes for any youth employment program authorized by this Code [the summer youth jobs program set forth in Section 2-503] without regard to fiscal year limitation. The Youth Jobs Fund may accept funds from public and private sources.
- (b) The Youth Jobs Fund shall be used to pay for any purpose authorized <u>for any youth</u> <u>employment program authorized by this Code</u> [under Section 2-503 for the summer youth jobs program], including administrative and vendor costs; provided, that not more than 10% of the funds expended annually from the Youth Jobs Fund shall be used for administrative or vendor costs.
- (c) During the fall of each year, on or before November 1, the Director of the Office of Human Resources Management or other designee of the County Executive shall submit to the County Council a report that details the activities, budget, and expenditures, at the program level, of all programs, activities, and projects undertaken by the Youth Jobs Fund from all available funding sources for the most recent fiscal year. The report shall include an assessment of ways to prospectively improve the administration and effectiveness of any youth employment program authorized by this Code. [the summer youth jobs program.]

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
