### **DIVISION 1. DEFINITIONS.**

#### Sec. 27-107.01. Definitions.

(a) Terms in the Zoning Ordinance are defined as follows:

(251) **Vehicle Sales Lot**: An area of land used for the storage and display for sale of any vehicle, which may also include the rental of vehicles.
