ZONING BILL

AN ORDINANCE concerning

Vehicle Sales Lot

For the purpose of expanding the definition of "vehicle sales lot" to include the rental of vehicles.

BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

Section 27-107.01,
The Zoning Ordinance of Prince George's County, Maryland,
being also
SUBTITLE 27. ZONING.
The Prince George's County Code
(1995 Edition).

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, sitting as the District Council for that part of the Maryland-Washington Regional District in Prince George's County, Maryland, that Section 27-107.01 of the Zoning Ordinance of Prince George's County, Maryland, being also Subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code, be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

SUBTITLE 27. ZONING.

PART 2. GENERAL.

DIVISION 1. DEFINITIONS.

Sec. 27-107.01. Definitions.

(a) Terms in the Zoning Ordinance are defined as follows:

* * * * *

(251) **Vehicle Sales Lot:** An area of land used for the storage and display for sale of any vehicle, which may also include the rental of vehicles.

* * * * *

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Ordinance shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after its adoption.
