<u>CR-81-2006 - A RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE 2001 WATER AND SEWER</u>
<u>PLAN LOCUST HILL PROPERTY</u> for the purpose of changing the water and sewer category designation of property within the 2001 Water and Sewer Plan. – <u>INTRODUCED</u>

Council Resolution 81 concerns the 2001 Water and Sewer Plan (Locust Hill Property) for the purpose of changing the water and sewer category designation of property within the 2001 Water and Sewer Plan. Council Resolution 81 was introduced by Council Member Dean and referred to the Transportation, Housing and the Environment (THE) Committee.

CR-82-2006 - A RESOLUTION CONCERNING PROGRAM REGULATIONS FOR THE PURCHASE OF DEVELOPMENT RIGHTS PROGRAM for the purpose of adopting the program regulations for the Purchase of Development Rights Program.

- INTRODUCED

Council Resolution 82 approves the program regulations and procedures for the Purchase of Development Rights Program ("PDR"). Council Resolution 82 was introduced by Council Members Peters and Dernoga and was referred to the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development (PZED) Committee.

Council Member Exum moved adoption of the Consent Agenda: seconded by Council Member Harrington. The motion carried by voice vote.

A letter was proposed urging the Department of Transportation to award the seven available U.S. China passenger frequencies for nonstop service between Washington, D.C. and Beijing, China. Robert Williams, Deputy Council Administrator, provided clarification and answered questions posed by Council Members Knotts and Dean. Council Member Campos moved to authorize the Chairman's signature; seconded by Council Member Exum. The motion carried 8-1. (Opposed: Council Member Knotts).

<u>CB-67-2006 – AN ACT CONCERNING MOBILE FOOD VENDING IN URBAN</u>
<u>AREAS</u> for the purpose of enhancing Livable Communities by authorizing the sale of certain food items by mobile food vendors and providing a licensing standard and definition for mobile food vendors. – <u>NO ACTION TAKEN</u>

<u>CB-82-2006 – AN ACT CONCERNING CABLE TELEVISION</u> for the purpose of granting a cable television franchise for the operation of a cable television system in Prince George's County, Maryland by prescribing certain terms and conditions to be included in a franchise agreement. – <u>REMOVED FROM AGENDA</u>

<u>CB-86-2006 - AN ACT CONCERNING PROPERTY TAX CREDIT – NONPROFIT SWIM CLUBS</u> for the purpose of granting a tax credit against property taxes imposed on nonprofit swim clubs that use their facilities exclusively to provide a recreational outlet for a local community. - <u>INTRODUCED</u>

Council Bill 86 grants a tax credit against property taxes imposed on nonprofit swim clubs that use their facilities exclusively to provide a recreational outlet for a local community. Council Bill 86 was introduced by Council Members Peters, Dernoga, Campos and Harrington. Council Bill 86 was referred to Health, Education and Human Services (HEHS) Committee.

PROGRAM FOR PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY FOR WATER AND SEWERAGE for the purpose of amending the WSSC Fiscal Years 2007-2012 Capital Improvement Program for Water and Sewerage. – PUBLIC HEARING HELD; ADOPTED
