Sec. 5-193.04. Violati	ons of law and monetary fines <u>and penalties</u> .
(a) Any person v	who shall sell, barter, or trade or offer or expose for sale, barter or trade in
or upon any street or h	ighway in the County, or go from house to house, either on foot, or with a
horse or other beast	of burden, or with a wagon, or motor vehicle, or other conveyance
whatsoever, upon the s	treets or highways in the County selling, bartering or trading or offering to
sell, barter or trade, or	from any roadside stand or roadside market upon any street or highway in

the County, any items except those expressly permitted by Section 5-193.01(b)(1) who operates

in violation of this Subtitle, or who knowingly directs or authorizes another person as an agent to do so, shall, upon citation issued by the Director of Environmental Resources, be deemed to have committed a violation of this Subtitle and shall pay the County a monetary fine of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each violation. Each separate day the violation remains uncorrected is a separate and distinct violation subject to an additional citation and fine.

- (b) The Department of Environmental Resources shall deliver or mail a citation to the responsible party(ies). The citation shall serve as the notification to the person that he has committed a civil violation and that he has been assessed a monetary fine, the nonpayment of which, in the absence of a successful appeal, shall result, where applicable, in the immediate revocation of the person's license.
- (c) A person who receives a citation may file with the Director a written notice of request for a hearing on the citation within five (5) days of the issuance of the citation. The Director shall render a decision within thirty (30) days of the hearing based upon the record compiled.
- (d) Any person who shall sell, barter, or trade or offer or expose for sale, barter or trade in or upon any street or highway in the County, or go from house to house, either on foot, or with a horse or other beast of burden, or with a wagon, or motor vehicle, or other conveyance whatsoever, upon the streets or highways in the County selling, bartering or trading or offering to sell, barter or trade, or from any roadside stand or roadside market upon any street or highway in the County, any items except those expressly permitted by Section 5-193.01(b)(1) who operates in violation of this Division, or who knowingly directs or authorizes another person as an agent to do so, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each offense.
