A RESOLUTION concerning

Health Atlas Public Health Impacts

For the purpose of directing the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission to coordinate with Prince George's County Health Department to develop a Health Atlas to further implement the Prince George's 2035 Approved General Plan (Plan 2035) and support datadriven policy making; directing the agencies to use the Health Atlas to analyze public health metrics in relationship with land uses to identify public health disparities, recommend equitable growth solutions and further enhance the quality of life for all residents of Prince George's County; directing the Department of Health to investigate the public health impact of convenience, tobacco and liquor stores on their surrounding communities.

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council is committed to an equitable approach to building healthy communities; and

WHEREAS, Plan 2035 is a comprehensive 20-year general plan that articulates a shared vision for making Prince George's County a leader in sustainable growth, vibrant neighborhoods, and a place where residents are healthy and engaged; and

WHEREAS, the Healthy Communities Element in Plan 2035 includes indicators and benchmarks that establish a collaborative framework to support how the region can address future challenges for maintaining healthy and thriving communities; and

WHEREAS, House Bill 286 (2025) included planning principles to support the creation of sustainable communities to foster a high quality of life for residents, especially in relationship to efficient use of land and transportation resources for more equitable communities, especially in areas historically underserved; and

WHEREAS, past land use decisions, especially in historically underserved areas, have contributed to underdevelopment of healthy food environments and public health disparities; and

WHEREAS, the neighborhood food environments in Prince George's County and resulting access to fresh, healthy foods vary by the geographic distribution of food stores, such as grocery stores, convenience stores and fast-food restaurants; and

WHEREAS, social science research has examined the correlation between tobacco outlet density and increased exposure to tobacco marketing, increased tobacco use among youth and heavier smoking patterns among adults; and

WHEREAS, a 2019 study in the Journal of Urban Health identified "alcohol outlet clusters" as an important social determinant of health in cities and noted that alcohol outlet density is associated with higher levels of alcohol consumption, misuse and related harms; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for greater research on these potential environmental factors of health disparities as a necessary step in data-driven policymaking and place-based interventions; and

WHEREAS, the County Council has identified the need for targeted research on the specific public health impacts of the geographic distribution of certain businesses within the county; and

WHEREAS, jurisdictions around the world have used tools such as a Health Atlas to gather, study and share place-based data in support of informed policymaking and advocacy; and

WHEREAS, the initiation of a Health Atlas will help to elevate health as a priority for the County's future growth and development and further support health and social equity through programs, policies and plans as led by the Prince George's County Health Department through PGC Health Zone, while partnering with agencies and community stakeholders, such as the Food Equity Council, and the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission's Prince George's County Department of Parks and Recreation; and

WHEREAS, the Health Atlas may also further understanding the implications of geographic locations of fast-food restaurants and the proliferation of certain auto-oriented uses, such as gas stations, drive-through businesses, etc., that may impact public health, while reviewing land use inequities, especially in Rural and Agricultural Areas and Established Communities (i.e. suburban areas), is in accordance with Healthy Communities Strategies 1.1, 2.1, 2.2, 2.4, 2.5, 3.2 and 4.1 of Plan 2035; and

WHEREAS, the Health Atlas will support the review of land use policies and regulations to explore incentives and community benefits for creating more healthy, thriving communities, including better access to urban agriculture and community gardens through locally-grown food, more diverse dining options that have fresh, nutritious foods to meet the County's public health goals, access to quality healthcare, while increasing access to public spaces to address lowering obesity rates, in addition to other health factors, and

WHEREAS, Section 12-101 of the County Code places responsibility on the Board of Health to oversee the health interests of County residents as well as review and make recommendations regarding policies related to public health in the County; and

WHEREAS, in carrying out its health oversight duties, the same section of the County Code authorizes the Board of Health to investigate and study the causes of diseases, epidemics and nuisances affecting public health; and

WHEREAS, Section 3-306 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, Health Article requires the County's designated health officer to perform any investigation directed by the board of health and submit appropriate reports to them; and

WHEREAS, the Annotated Code of Maryland, Health Article Section 3-202 authorizes each county board of health to set fees or charges in connection with its rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Planning Department of the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, in partnership with the Prince George's County Health Department, is best suited to undertake this study of public health and land use policies and report back to the County Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Prince George's County Planning Department of the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission is hereby requested to develop a Health Atlas for Prince George's County and propose recommendations for developing healthy development standards, incentives and further implementation of Healthy Communities Strategies as identified in Plan 2035, by submitting a comprehensive report to the County Council on or before June 30, 2026.

BE FURTHER IT RESOLVED that County Health Officer is hereby directed to utilize the Health Atlas to conduct an investigation of the public health impact of convenience, tobacco and

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liquor stores on their surrounding communities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the investigation should identify any specific public health impacts arising from the geographic distribution of such businesses throughout the County as well as identify any health disparities which can be correlated to or caused by proximity to such businesses.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the investigation should recommend policies or services to be carried out by the Department of Health which have been proven successful to mitigate or eliminate identified negative public health impacts or health disparities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Health Officer shall submit to the County Council the findings of this investigation and resulting recommendations no later than June 30, 2026.
