**PERMITS** for the purpose of authorizing all immediate reasonable and necessary action to cease and desist the operation of any activity requiring a use and occupancy permit when a use and occupancy permit has not been issued; authorizing all immediate reasonable and necessary action to cease and desist the operation of any activity requiring a use and occupancy permit when a use and occupancy permit has been issued and is not in compliance with the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance; authorizing all immediate reasonable and necessary action to cease and desist the operation of any activity requiring a use and occupancy permit when the activity is found to present an imminent danger and threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the public by not doing so, that there are no other mitigating circumstances to be taken to resolve the imminent danger and threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the public, and that there are no other reasonable means of preventing further danger and threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the public resulting from the continuation of the activity; authorizing all immediate reasonable and necessary action to cease and desist the operation of any activity requiring a temporary use and occupancy permit when a temporary use and occupancy permit has not been issued; authorizing all immediate reasonable and necessary action to cease and desist the operation of any activity requiring a temporary use and occupancy permit when a temporary use and occupancy permit has been issued and is not in compliance with the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance; authorizing all immediate reasonable and necessary action to cease and desist the operation of any activity requiring a temporary use and occupancy permit when the activity is found to present an imminent danger and threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the public by not doing so, that there are no other mitigating circumstances to be taken to resolve the imminent danger and threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the public, and that there are no other reasonable means of preventing further danger and threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the public resulting from the continuation of the activity; authorizing all immediate reasonable and necessary action to implement this Act for the health, safety and welfare of the public; providing for the designation of certain public officials to enforce this Act; providing for enforcement procedures to implement this Act; providing for establishing policies, rules, and procedures to implement this Act; providing for a hearing before the Zoning Hearing Examiner from a violation of this Act; providing for an appeal from the decision of the Zoning Hearing Examiner to the Circuit Court of Maryland; providing for the computation of time pursuant to this Act; and generally relating to use and occupancy permits.
