## RESOLUTION

## A RESOLUTION concerning

Designation—Maryland Transit-Oriented Development Site— Seabrook MARC Station For the purpose of expressing support for the designation of the Seabrook MARC Station and its surrounding area as a Maryland Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) site.

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council recognizes the strategic importance of promoting sustainable growth and development within the County to enhance quality of life, economic vitality, and accessibility for its residents; and

WHEREAS, Seabrook, located along the Lanham-Severn corridor and served by the Seabrook MARC Station as the second stop north of Union Station, demonstrates significant potential for development as a vibrant neighborhood center offering alternative housing choices and walkable amenities for the local community; and

WHEREAS, the Seabrook area is adjacent to key employment and activity centers, including NASA Goddard Space Flight Center, the potential future FBI Headquarters at the Greenbelt Metro Station, and the potential site of a U.S. Bureau of Engraving and Printing production facility, making it an attractive location for households seeking proximity to these facilities; and

WHEREAS, Seabrook is characterized by limited multifamily development but holds the potential to capture demand for diverse housing options near these major employment hubs and adjoining facilities; and

WHEREAS, the area is part of the 2010 *Prince George's County Glenn Dale—Seabrook—Lanham & Vicinity Sector Plan*, which emphasizes the need for thoughtful and sustainable

development to serve the needs of residents and businesses; and

WHEREAS, the Council supports the following planning principles to guide TOD at the Seabrook MARC Station:

- 1. Creating a pedestrian-friendly destination with a mix of land uses to foster neighborhood gathering and cohesion;
- 2. Promoting alternative housing options that support MARC ridership and neighborhood retail and services;
  - 3. Improving connectivity to adjacent neighborhoods for enhanced accessibility;
- 4. Elevating the pedestrian experience of Lanham-Severn Road as a neighborhood main street;
- 5. Maximizing underutilized properties to establish a cohesive and vibrant neighborhood center; and

WHEREAS, the TOD designation for Seabrook will enhance the community's walkability, provide alternative transportation options, promote environmental sustainability, and generate economic growth through the development of mixed-use spaces and improved connectivity; and

WHEREAS, the Council believes that securing the Maryland TOD designation for Seabrook is vital to fulfilling the County's goals of fostering equitable and sustainable growth.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Prince George's County Council that the Council fully supports the designation of the Seabrook MARC Station and its surrounding area as a Maryland TOD site.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Council urges the Maryland Department of Transportation and other relevant State agencies to grant TOD designation to Seabrook, recognizing its potential as a vital hub for housing, employment, and neighborhood development.
