WHEREAS	, the Senate introduced SB167 in January 2011, and respectively introduced		
HB470 in the Ho	use of Delegates in February 2011; and		
WHEREAS, the Bills, coined the "Maryland Dream Act" would provide undocumented			
mmigrants acces	s to Maryland public higher education institutions at in-state or in-county rates		
where they were p	previously barred, and		
WHEREAS, On March 7, 2011 an Immigrant rally in Annapolis brought over 1,500			
participants; and			
WHEREAS	EAS, demonstrators contended that the "Maryland Dream Act" is critical as higher		
out of state rates have prevented many immigrants from attending college; and			
WHEREAS, public elementary and secondary schools are required to accept undocumented			
mmigrants; and			
WHEREAS	, the Bill, as amended by the Senate, will provide that the students who attended		
Maryland public or nonpublic school for three consecutive years prior to making an application			
for enrollment with a Maryland public University or Community College may be exempt from			
paying out-of-stat	te or out-of-county tuition rates; and		

WHEREAS, out-of-state tuition rates for full time undergraduates enrolled in Maryland's

community colleges average two to three times the proposed fall 2011 in-state rates; and

WHEREAS, out-of-state tuition costs for full time undergraduates enrolled in Maryland's public four-year institutions averaged more than \$10,000 greater than the in-state costs for the proposed fall 2011 school year; and

WHEREAS, On March 8, 2011, the Montgomery County Council passed a Resolution encouraging the Maryland General Assembly to adopt House Bill 470 and Senate Bill 167 asserting that access to education is a cornerstone of our democratic values as a nation and children who have been raised and educated within their community should not be limited from access to higher education,

WHEREAS, The Prince George's County Council recognizes the significance of providing equitable access to education, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland hereby supports and encourages the Maryland General Assembly to adopt House Bill 470 and Senate Bill 167, Public Institutions of Higher Education – Tuition Rates – Exemptions which would grant in-state tuition to students from Maryland tax-paying families who attend and graduate from Maryland high schools, regardless of their immigration status.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the Council is hereby directed to send a copy of this Resolution to the Honorable Governor and Lt. Governor of Maryland, the Honorable President of the Maryland State Senate, the Honorable Speaker of the Maryland House of Delegates, and the Honorable Chairs of the Prince George's County Senate and House Delegations.
