1 A RESOLUTION concerning

2                   Supplementary Appropriations of Federal, State and Other Funds

3 For the purpose of appropriating funding from grants in the amount of \$4,848,570.00 to the  
4 Department of Social Services, the Circuit Court for Prince George's County, the Department of  
5 Family Services, the Department of Corrections, the Office of Community Relations, the Police  
6 Department, the Health Department, the Department of Housing and Community Development  
7 and the Fire/EMS Department.

8           WHEREAS, CB-32-2015, as amended, adopted and enacted the Annual Budget and  
9 Appropriation Ordinance of Prince George's County for Fiscal Year 2016, which set forth the  
10 amount of grant funds to be appropriated; and

11           WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 815 of the Charter of Prince George's County, Maryland,  
12 the County Council, upon recommendation of the County Executive, may, by resolution, make  
13 additional or supplementary appropriations from Federal, State or private grants which were not  
14 included in the budget for the current fiscal year; and

15           WHEREAS, additional grant awards have been received; and

16           WHEREAS, the County Executive has duly recommended that supplementary  
17 appropriations be made.

18           NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's  
19 County, Maryland, that the Fiscal Year 2016 Approved Current Expense Budget, Federal

## **EXPLANATION OF ADJUSTMENTS**

### **Department of Social Services**

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development awarded \$203,257.00 for the Success Rapid Re-Housing Program. Funding provided for homelessness prevention and rapid re-housing which supports short term rental assistance in an effort to prevent homelessness.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development awarded \$19,739.00 in additional funding for the HELP/HOPE Merged (Permanent Housing for People with Disabilities) Program. Funding supports permanent housing for homeless people.

The Maryland Department of Human Resources awarded seventeen dollars (\$17) in additional funding for the Food Stamp Employment and Training/Able Bodied Adults Without Dependents Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (FSET/ABAWD/SNAP). Funding is provided to support costs related to assisting food stamp recipients in attaining long-term self-sufficiency through suitable employment.

The Maryland Department of Human Resources awarded \$75,000.00 for the Foster Youth Employment Program. This Program is part of the existing Welfare Reform-Work Opportunities Program. Funding supports the cost of providing employment-related assistance to clients of various benefit programs. Job development, referrals, placements, and job-seeking skills training are some of the components of this initiative, which seeks to reduce welfare dependency through employment.

### **Circuit Court for Prince George's County**

The Maryland Administrative Office of the Courts through the Maryland Judicial Center awarded \$26,037.00 in additional funding under the Family Division Legislative Initiative Grant. Funding provides three services: (1) a one-stop information and referral center; (2) the Family Support Services Unit which provides certain family support services (e.g. mediation, domestic violence coordination, clinical assessment and referral services); and, (3) enhanced monitoring, scheduling, and oversight functions in the family law area.

The Maryland Administrative Office of the Courts, through the Maryland Judicial Center, awarded \$56,285.00 in additional funding for the Adult/Juvenile/Re-Entry/Veterans Court. Funding supports: the operations of the Drug Court, including reimbursing salaries for legal staff and operating expenses in order to promote the full institutionalization of Drug Court programs across the State of Maryland. Funding also supports direct client services, staff education, partnership expansion and other services focused on program development, with an emphasis on the major role family life plays in the lives of young people experiencing substance abuse issues. Funding also promotes a comprehensive court program. The target population for the Re-Entry Court Program consists of incarcerated individuals, with alcohol or drug related problems/dependencies, which have two or more years remaining on their sentences. Upon admission, participants receive court ordered treatment and enter into a two phase residential/outpatient treatment program under the Department of Corrections and Work Release Center in Prince George's County. The funds support salary and benefits for grant-funded court positions limited to Problem-Solving Court Coordinator and Case Manager(s).

### **Department of Family Services**

The Corporation for National and Community Service awarded one dollar (\$1.00) in additional funding; requiring a County match of six dollars (\$6.00) for the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP). Funding provides volunteer service opportunities in County government and with non-profit agencies for approximately six hundred (600) older County residents (55 years old or older). Volunteers serve on a part-time basis and are compensated for mileage.

The Corporation for National and Community Service awarded thirty eight dollars (\$38.00) in additional funding for the Foster Grandparent Program thereby decreasing the County cash contribution by \$14,192.00. Funding supports low-income senior citizens as foster grandparents to work with physically, mentally, and emotionally disabled children in centers throughout the County. These children otherwise may not receive the personal attention necessary for their social adjustment and maturation.

The Maryland Department of Juvenile Services awarded thirty five dollars (\$35.00) in additional funding for the Children In Need Of Supervision ("CINS") Diversion Program. Programming

helps to divert status-offending youth from deeper involvement with the Maryland Department of Juvenile Services (“DJS”) by engaging youth and their families; assessing their needs and linking them with community-based treatment providers to address the issues that have resulted in DJS involvement.

The Department of Juvenile Services awarded twenty seven dollars (\$27.00) in additional funding for the Multi-Systemic Therapy (DJS) program. Funding provides for an intensive family and community based treatment model that addresses the multiple determinants of serious antisocial behavior in juvenile offenders. Referrals for this funding stream are received only from the Department of Juvenile Services.

### **Department of Corrections**

The Governor’s Office of Crime Control and Prevention (GOCCP) awarded forty four dollars (\$44.00) in additional funding for the Community Services Program. Funding develops and establishes non-profit, charitable, and governmental work sites for adult, non-violent offenders who are assigned by the court to perform community service work as a condition of probation.

### **Office of Community Relations**

The U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) awarded \$14,850.00 in additional funding for the EEOC Work Sharing Agreement. Funding provides financial assistance through a work sharing agreement. These funds are provided as a result of investigations conducted by the Commission with regard to allegations of discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, sex (including pregnancy), national origin, age (40 years old or older), disability, or genetic information that occur in Prince George’s County. The EEOC reimburses the Commission a fixed amount per case.

### **Police Department**

The Target Corporation awarded \$17,000.00 for the National Night Out, Hero & Helpers & Crime Prevention Program. Funding will be used to enhance community relations by providing assistance to under privileged children. Funding will also support the purchase of equipment to identify suspects involved in organized retail theft for the Department’s Retail Theft Unit.

**Health Department**

The Maryland Department of Mental Health and Hygiene awarded \$30,000.00 for the Komen National Vulnerable Population Grant. Funding supports the goal to decrease breast cancer mortality among vulnerable populations and build strategies for the Maryland Comprehensive Cancer Control Plan.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health and Hygiene awarded \$75,000.00 for the Health Systems Initiatives for Tobacco Dependence Grant. Funding will support the implementation of a partnership between the Department and Doctor's Community Hospital to improve the evidence based programming for tobacco independence. Funding will also make improvements to the health system infrastructure in order to address tobacco dependence in adults in the County.

The United States Department of Health and Human Services, Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), through the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, awarded \$2,500.00 in additional funding for the Oral Health Clinical Care Program. Funding is provided to improve the oral health of Maryland residents. Services will be provided via the Deamonte Driver Dental Van.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health and Hygiene awarded an additional \$96,232.00 for the Women, Infants and Children ("WIC") Breastfeeding Peer Counseling Project. Funding will support compensation and fringe benefit costs for staff to encourage women to breastfeed infants.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health and Hygiene awarded an additional \$184,060.00 for the Women, Infants and Children ("WIC") Program. Funding will provide nutrition education and selected supplemental foods to low income pregnant, breastfeeding, and postpartum women with children from birth to five (5) years old identified to have nutritional risks.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health and Hygiene, Infectious Disease Prevention and Health Services Bureau awarded an additional \$185,046.00 for the Sexually Transmitted Disease

Caseworker Program in order to investigate sexually transmitted diseases and ensure follow up to prevent further transmission. Funding will provide clients with accessible, comprehensive and coordinated HIV medical services, encouraging the continuity of care and improving health outcomes through partnerships with community based organizations and specialty providers.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health and Hygiene, Infectious Disease Prevention and Health Services Bureau awarded an additional \$95,000.00 for the Partnership for Care Program. This Program emphasizes connecting HIV clients to care and services. Funding will support salaries, and fringe benefit costs.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health and Hygiene, Infectious Disease Prevention and Health Services Bureau awarded an additional \$88,950.00 for AIDS Case Management. Funding will provide medical case management for those infected with HIV including retaining clients in care. Medical case management provides the necessary support services to clients such as connecting them to social services, and assisting with housing needs, transportation for medical appointments, and emergency financial assistance to improve health outcomes.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health and Hygiene, Infectious Disease Prevention and Health Services Bureau awarded an additional \$74,000.00 for the Administrative Care Coordination Ombudsman Grant. Funding will assist Medicaid eligible clients and HealthChoice recipients to navigate the HealthChoice system to effectively utilize their Medicaid benefits.

The United States Department of Health and Human Services, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration awarded \$1,199,565.00 for the Offender Reentry Program. Funding will support the existing offender reentry services provided by the Behavioral Health Services Program.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health and Hygiene awarded \$67,000.00 for the Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) Ebola Supplemental Program. Funding will be used to create Ebola and communicable disease presentations in conjunction with an on-line training for

education and outreach to the community.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health and Hygiene awarded an additional \$1,152.00 for the Cities Readiness Initiative. Funding will enhance the County's preparedness for a bioterrorism event. Primary objectives include interoperable communications, standardization of equipment, regional risk communication, and training drills and exercises.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health and Hygiene awarded an additional \$5,707.00 for the Lead Paint Poisoning Outreach Program. Funding will support the management of cases where children have elevated blood lead levels, investigating instances of high lead exposure, enforcing the standards required of lead inspectors, and providing information to educate parents, renters, landlords, and homeowners.

#### **Department of Housing and Community Development**

The United States Department of Housing and Community Development awarded an additional \$235,580.00 for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). Funding will support the development of viable communities by providing decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expanding economic opportunities.

The United States Department of Housing and Community Development awarded an additional \$132,716.00 of program income for the CDBG Single Family Rehabilitation Loan Program. This Program provides for the upgrade of deteriorated dwellings to contemporary minimum property standards including the elimination of housing code violations and the removal of architectural barriers.

The United States Department of Housing and Community Development awarded an additional \$313,696.00 for the CDBG My HOME Homeownership Assistance Program. This includes a reduction of \$131,204.00 to reflect the funding allocation recommendation included in the FY 2016 Annual Action Plan CR-09-2015. This program provides staff and operational support for the Redevelopment Authority of Prince George's County.



The United States Department of Housing and Community Development awarded an additional \$134,135.00 for the HOME-Homeowner Rehabilitation Loan Program. Funding will provide down payment and closing cost assistance to eligible homebuyers to purchase for sale, foreclosed, or owner occupied short-sale residential properties in the County.

**Fire/EMS Department**

The United States Department of Homeland Security awarded \$1,975,000.00 for the BioWatch Program. Funding will support the mission to deploy, sustain, and maintain a national operation with the ability to detect and respond to a bioterrorist event, focusing on major population centers and additional venues as needed due to risk or threat.
