## PUBLIC SAFETY & FISCAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT Date: 6/26/00

Committee Vote: Favorable, 4-0, (In favor: Council Members Wilson, Estepp, Maloney and Scott).

This bill will authorize the appropriation of additional revenue from available and uncommitted fund balances to the Drug Enforcement and Education Special Revenue Fund resulting from forfeiture of assets seized by the Police Department or Federal agencies. A portion of the revenue will provide matching funds for Police Department grant programs and will support laboratory renovations and specialized equipment costs. This legislation will not affect the County's General Fund.

The Director of Finance has certified in writing that \$500,000 is available from fund balance for this appropriation.

There should not be any negative fiscal impact on the County as a result of enacting CB-67-2000.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT (Includes reason for proposal, as well as any unique statutory requirements)

This legislation authorizes the appropriation of fund balance in the Drug Enforcement and Education Special Revenue Fund, resulting from proceeds of forfeitures of assets seized by the Police Department or Federal agencies.
