Staff gave an overview of the resolution indicating that it approves amendments to the City of Bowie's Code concerning residential parking to allow the parking of open watercraft (such as a jet ski) on a paved area of a residential lot.

Council Member Scott, the resolution's sponsor, indicated to the Committee that she proposed this resolution as a proforma procedure since the State Charter requires the Council's approval of municipal ordinances regulating parking, fences and outdoor storage.

The Legislative Officer finds the bill to be in proper legislative form. The Executive Branch takes no position on the resolution. The Office of Audits and Investigations has determined there should be no negative fiscal impact on the County as a result of adopting CR-31-1998.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT

Article 28, Section 8-112.1 of the Annotated Code of Maryland requires that certain municipal ordinances regulating residential parking, fences, and outdoor storage be approved by the District Council before the ordinance becomes effective. This is a resolution to approve amendments to the City of Bowie's Code. The resolution will approve the enactment of Ordinance O-8-98, amending Chapter 26 of the Bowie City Code concerning residential parking.
