RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

Agricultural Preservation Work Group

For the purpose of expanding the mission of the Agricultural Preservation Work Group to review, evaluate and recommend "low impact development" technologies and other measures to improve agricultural operations as recommended by the 2010 Equine Industry Task Force, and amending the composition of the Work Group.

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council adopted CR-8-2010 reconvening the Agricultural Preservation Work Group to review and evaluate present agricultural preservation policies and recommend to the County Council appropriate revisions to existing policies and laws; and

WHEREAS, the Rural Tier of Prince George's County, as designated in the 2002 *Approved General Plan*, as amended, encompasses the eastern and southern portions of the County, in the Patuxent River, Potomac River, and Mattawoman Creek watersheds, including 171 square miles, approximately 35 percent of the County's land area; and

WHEREAS, the Rural Tier is the most scenic part of the County, characterized by fine and diverse landscapes, many of the County's remaining farmlands, extensive woodlands and wetland areas, numerous streams and stream valleys, and diverse wildlife habitat; and

WHEREAS, the main features of the Rural Tier, forests and agricultural lands, present unique planning, land use, and development issues and policy problems; and

WHEREAS, during the 2006 Legislative Year, the County Council proposed various legislation for the purpose of establishing a comprehensive policy on agricultural preservation in the Rural Tier; and

WHEREAS, CR-87-2006, adopted on November 28, 2006, established the Agricultural Preservation Work Group to review and evaluate agricultural preservation policies and recommend to the County Council appropriate revisions to existing policies and laws; and

WHEREAS, the Agricultural Preservation Work Group held 25 meetings over an 18-month period and conducted a comprehensive review of all preservation mechanisms and all County policies including MALPF, Rural Legacy, Tree Conservation, PDRs, Transfer of Development Rights, Right to Farm, Property Tax Exemptions, and State of the Agricultural Industry and Potential Marketing Options; and

WHEREAS, the Agricultural Preservation Work Group provided a briefing on their efforts and recommendations to the Planning, Zoning, and Economic Development Committee on October 1, 2008; and

WHEREAS, after the term of the Agricultural Preservation Work Group expired, there was no forum to discuss agricultural policy issues affecting the county; and

WHEREAS, with the adoption of CR-8-2010, the County Council reconvened the Agricultural Preservation Work Group to continue reviewing and evaluating the success of existing agricultural preservation programs and to continue working on a comprehensive policy on agricultural preservation with participation by affected stakeholders, and to consider other policies and laws that would benefit agriculture in the County; and

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council adopted CR-29-2010 and CR-47-2010 establishing the Equine Industry Task Force to explore and facilitate the economic development potential of the equine industry in Prince George's County; and

WHEREAS, the Equine Industry Task Force presented its report to the County Council on September 21, 2010 and recommended an environmental impact study group to explore best management practices and methods to improve agricultural operations including equine activities; and

WHEREAS, the Equine Industry Task Force recommended collaboration between the Agricultural Preservation Work Group, the Maryland State and Prince George's County Farm Bureaus along with experts from the University of Maryland, including the University of Maryland Extension, Soil Conservation District, United States Natural Resources Conservation Service, Maryland Horse Industry Board, Maryland Horse Council, the Chesapeake Bay Foundation, animal control and nutrient management technicians and the Maryland State

Department of Agriculture and Department of Natural Resources; and

WHEREAS, Section 506 of the County Charter provides that the County Council may appoint, for designated periods, temporary citizen advisory boards to assist in the consideration of County policies and programs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the mission of the Agricultural Preservation Work Group is hereby expanded and the composition is hereby amended to include two additional members.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Agricultural Preservation Work Group shall be composed of 15 members including two additional members representing the Equine Industry Task Force established pursuant to CR-29-2010 and CR-47-2010 and 13 other members appointed by the Council Chairman in consultation with the Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Agricultural Preservation Work Group shall review existing agricultural preservation programs and recommend policies and such other measures that would enhance or preserve agriculture in the County as the Work Group decides to review and analyze.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council Administrator shall assign appropriate technical and administrative support personnel to assist the Agricultural Preservation Work Group in its work, and additional support shall be provided by the Prince George's County Planning Director (or the Planning Director's designee).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Agricultural Preservation Work Group shall prepare and deliver its recommendations on the expanded mission to the County Council on or before November 1, 2011 and shall periodically present its recommendations on other matters to the County Council when deemed appropriate by the Work Group Chairman.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Agricultural Preservation Work Group shall cease to exist at such time as the County Council confirms the members of the Agricultural Resources Advisory Board.
