**REPORT:** Committee Vote: Favorable with amendments 5-0 (In favor: Chair Harrison, Vice Chair Watson, Council Members Blegay, Hawkins, and Oriadha).

CR-009-2024 was introduced and referred to the Education and Workforce Development Committee on February 27, 2024. The resolution would create a School Pedestrian Safety Workgroup to study and suggest solutions to improve child pedestrian safety in the County.

The Policy Analysis and Fiscal Impact Statement, provided by David Noto, states that any fiscal impact on the resolution would be absorbed by Council staff. The policy analyst also noted that there may be some challenges in generating a final list of recommendations given the short span of the Workgroup and also suggested connecting the resolution with past work from the County's Vision Zero Program.

Vice Chair Watson read a statement from the primary sponsor, Council Member Fisher, in support of the resolution.

The County Executive's liaison, Sakinda Skinner, provided two friendly amendments to change the appointment of the Prince George's County Police officer and designee from the Department of Public Works to be appointed by the County Executive rather than the County Council.

On March 25, 2024, the Education and Workforce Development Committee voted favorable 5-0, as amended.
