Prince George's Community College:

Equity through Certification, Education and Training

- The program provides an Information Technology (IT) pathway to support courses and training opportunities to introduce/upgrade the information technology skills of senior citizens, and to equip residents with new competencies and certifications necessary for career advancement.
- The second component of the program focuses on tuition assistance via full and partial scholarships for credit/non-credit courses at the College; these scholarships are for eligible residents living within the eligible communities.

Financial Empowerment Center

• The FEC@PGCC plans to operate from the Tanger Outlets of Employ Prince George's and serve up to 300 unique clients to help residents explore the landscape of financial therapy and wellness, experience financial freedom, and increase financial capability.

Prince George's Memorial Library

• Funding supports a Kids Achieve Club at the Oxon Hill Branch Library (Oxon Hill Achievers). The program will provide one-one-one reading support to children in grades 1-3 to advance literacy skills.
