LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

Fiscal and Planning Committee Report Date: June 25, 1990

Committee Vote: Favorable, 5-1 (In favor: Council Member Castaldi, Kinnon, Pemberton. Opposed: Council Member Wilson).

This legislation contains the enabling authority required to implement the programming schedule which is described in the Adopted Fiscal Year 1991-1996 Capital Improvement Program for Fiscal Years 1990-91 and 1991-92.

The Office of Law and Legislative Officer have reviewed the legislation and find it to be in proper legislative form with no legal impediments to its adoption.

There will not be any direct fiscal impact on the County as a result of adopting CB-74-1990.

Section 814 of the County Charter provides for the financing of capital projects pursuant to the passage of enabling legislation. Section 323 of the County Charter provides for the Council to refer to the voters of the County any act enabling the County to borrow money to finance capital projects. Each enabling act shall authorize borrowing for either a single capital project or a number of projects of the same generic class.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT (Includes reason for proposal, as well as any unique statutory requirements)

This bill if, approved by the voters at the next general election, will provide the County with the enabling authority to sell \$32,306,000 in general obligation bonds for 10 public safety related projects. Included in the legislation are Police, Fire, and Department of Corrections projects. This legislation contains the enabling authority required to implement the programming schedule which is described in the Adopted FY1991-FY1996 Capital Improvement Program for fiscal years 1991 and 1992.
