WHEREAS	, Section 4-352(i) of the Building Code requires that the Director of the			
Department of E	nvironmental Resources submit a schedule of miscellaneous building permit			
fees to the Count	y Council for adoption every year commencing in Fiscal Year 2009; and			
WHEREAS	, the fee amounts contained in the schedule are required to be adjusted, at a			
minimum, to refl	ect the annual average increase in the Consumer Price Index for all urban			
consumers publis	shed by the United States Department of Labor, for the fiscal year preceding the			
year for which th	e amount is being calculated and to be rounded to the nearest Five Dollar			
(\$5.00) incremen	it; and			
WHEREAS	, the Director, pursuant to Section 4-352, has submitted a schedule of			
miscellaneous bu	ailding permit fees to the Council.			
NOW, THE	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's			
County, Marylan	d, that the Schedule of Miscellaneous Building Permit Fees, included herein, be			
and the same is h	ereby approved in accordance with Section 4-352 of the Building Code.			
BE IT FUR	THER RESOLVED that the Schedule of Miscellaneous Building Permit Fees			
shall not take eff	ect until CB-13 -2009 becomes effective.			
SC	HEDULE OF MISCELLANEOUS BUILDING PERMIT FEES			

(1) **Minimum Permit Fee**:

(A) One- and Two-Family Dwellings: Fifty-five Dollars (\$55.00).

- (B) Commercial Buildings: Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) per discipline.
- (2) **Filing Fee**: A nonrefundable filing fee per permit application for all new buildings, structures, and/or grading shall be a minimum of Fifty-five Dollars (\$55.00) and not more than fifty percent (50%) of the estimated cost of the permit, and shall be applied to the permit fee if the permit is actually issued within six (6) months of the date of the application; otherwise, the permit application shall expire and the filing fee shall be forfeited.
- (3) **Re-Inspection**: For each additional inspection that is required because: 1) the work is not installed according to approved plans; 2) the work is not ready for inspection; and 3) the site is not accessible, the following fees shall apply:
 - (A) One- and Two-Family Dwellings: Fifty-five Dollars (\$55.00).
 - (B) Commercial Buildings: Fifty-five Dollars (\$55.00) per discipline.
- (4) **Inspection After Hours**: One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per inspection per discipline.
- (5) **Permit Revision/Modification**: Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00).
- (6) Use and Occupancy:
 - (A) One- and Two-Family Dwellings: Fifty-five Dollars (\$55.00).
- (B) Commercial Buildings: Thirty-five Dollars (\$35.00) per each engineering discipline: electrical, mechanical, structural, fire and life safety.
- (C) Investigation for Partial Occupancy: When a building contractor, permittee, or other responsible party allows the building or structure or portion thereof to be occupied or used without the required Use and Occupancy permit and final inspection, an investigation fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) (residential) or Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) (commercial) will be levied against the responsible party.

(7) Plans Revision:

- (A) One- and Two-Family Dwellings: Twenty Dollars (\$20.00), if there is no change in building dimensions.
- (B) Commercial Buildings: Thirty-five Dollars (\$35.00) per discipline, if there is no change in building dimensions.
- (C) If an extensive plans review is required, the fee shall be sufficient to offset the cost of plans review and services as determined by the Building Official.
- (8) **Finishing Basement (One- and Two-Family Dwellings**): Two Hundred and Twenty-five Dollars (\$225.00).

1 (9) **Renewing a Permit**: 2 (A) One- and Two-Family Dwellings: Forty-five Dollars (\$45.00). 3 (B) Commercial Buildings: Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00). (C) If construction has not begun; all original previous fees paid are credited against the 4 5 total fees computed under the current fee schedule. 6 (D) If construction has started, fees shall be based upon the remaining work to be 7 completed, computed under the current fee schedule, with no credit for fees previously paid. 8 (10) **Private In-Ground Pool**: One Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$150.00). 9 (11) **Private Above-Ground Pool**: Fifty-five Dollars (\$55.00). 10 (12) **Commercial Swimming Pools**: Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00). (13) Raze Permits: 11 (A) One- and Two-Family Dwellings: Permit fees for the demolition of one- and two-12 13 family dwellings shall be Fifty-five Dollars (\$55.00). Raze permit fees for 14 Townhouses/Townhomes shall be paid similar to commercial buildings. 15 (B) Commercial Buildings: Permit fees for the demolition of a commercial building shall 16 be Eighty-five Dollars (\$85.00). 17 (14) **Moving a Building**: The fee for moving any building or structure shall be Fifteen Dollars 18 (\$15.00) plus Three Dollars (\$3.00) for each Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) of estimated cost 19 of work. A minimum cost of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) will be used to determine the 20 permit fee for moving all commercial buildings. 21 (15) **Revising Permit Applications**: Thirty-five Dollars (\$35.00). 22 (16) **Elevators**: One percent (1%) of the construction cost but not less than Seventy-five Dollars 23 (\$75.00).24 (17) **Chair Lift**: Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00). 25 (18) **Fence Permit**: Fifty-five Dollars (\$55.00) Residential and Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) 26 Commercial. 27 (19) **Decks**: Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00). 28 (20) **Gazebos**: Fifty-five Dollars (\$55.00). 29 (21) Change of Ownership: Eighty-five Dollars (\$85.00) for a change of ownership or tenancy 30 in which there have been no physical changes or alterations and a Certificate of Occupancy has

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been previously issued.

1 (22) **Temporary Use and Occupancy**: Eighty-five Dollars (\$85.00) for all structures installed 2 for temporary use or for temporary use of a newly constructed building prior to the final Use and 3 Occupancy approval. 4 (23) **Partial Use and Occupancy**: When a building contractor, permittee, or other responsible 5 party allows the building, or structure, or portion thereof to be occupied or used without the 6 required Use and Occupancy permit and final inspection, an investigation fee of One Hundred 7 Dollars (\$100.00) (residential) or Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) (commercial) will be levied 8 against the responsible party. 9 (24) **Special Investigation**: Whenever any work for which a permit is required under Subtitle 4 10 has been started prior to obtaining a permit, a special investigation shall be made before an 11 application may be filed to request the required permit. In addition to the filing fee and regular 12 permit, an investigation fee of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) for residential and Two 13 Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) for commercial shall be paid at the time of filing the 14 application for the required permit. Whenever work under a permit that has been placed, 15 partially completed, or concealed without first obtaining a required inspection approval, the 16 Building Official shall cause a special investigation to be made. The fee for the special investigation shall be One Hundred and Ten Dollars (\$110.00) for residential and Two Hundred 17 18 and Fifteen Dollars (\$215.00) for commercial and payable before further inspection will be 19 provided. 20 (25) Accessory Buildings such as Sheds, 150 Square Feet and Larger: Sixty Dollars 21 (\$60.00). 22 (26) Accessory Buildings such as Sheds, Smaller than 150 Square Feet: No Permit is 23 required. 24 (27) Sunrooms, Porches and Garages (attached or detached): Permit fees shall be based 25 upon the area (as calculated from exterior dimensions) and square foot construction costs set 26 forth in the Building Valuation Data "Type of Construction Factor" published by the 27 International Code Council, corresponding to the appropriate use group and type of construction 28 and a fee multiplier of 0.0060. 29 (28) Carports: Permit fees shall be based upon the square foot construction costs set forth in

the Building Valuation Data "Type of Construction Factor" published by the International Code

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- Council, corresponding to the appropriate use group and type of construction and a fee multiplier of 0.0060.
- 3 (29) **Fire Damage**: The permit fee for repairing and/or re-installing the damaged members of
- 4 the building such as beams, columns, walls and roofs that have been damaged due to fire shall be
- 5 based on Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) plus Three Dollars (\$3.00) per Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00)
- 6 of the construction cost; Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) minimum.
- 7 (30) **Driveways**: Sixty Dollars (\$60.00).
- 8 (31) **Mobile/Replacement Homes**: Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) if inspection is
- 9 made by a third party and Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) if inspection is made by
- 10 County personnel.
- 11 (32) **Fireplaces (One- and Two-Family Dwellings)**: Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00).
- 12 (33) **Retaining Walls, Two Feet and Taller**: Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) plus Three Dollars
- 13 (\$3.00) per Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) of the construction cost; Seventy-five Dollars
- 14 | (\$75.00) minimum.
- 15 | (34) Patios, Five Hundred Square Feet and Larger: Sixty Dollars (\$60.00).
- 16 (35) Patios, under Five Hundred Square Feet: No Permit is required.
- 17 | (36) **Pole Bases**: Thirty-five Dollars (\$35.00) each; Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) minimum.
- 18 (37) **Awnings**: Thirty-five Dollars (\$35.00) each; Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) minimum.
- 19 (38) **Open Pit**: Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00).
- 20 (39) Waterproofing: One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).
- 21 (40) Wheelchair Ramps: Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00).
- 22 | (41) **Roofing**: Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) plus Three Dollars (\$3.00) per Five Hundred Dollars
- 23 (\$500.00) of the construction cost; Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) minimum.
- 24 (42) Satellite Dishes, Two Feet in Diameter and Larger: Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00).
- 25 (43) **Observation Stands**: Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) plus Three Dollars (\$3.00) per Five Hundred
- 26 Dollars (\$500.00) of the construction cost; Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) minimum.
- 27 | (44) Solar Panels: Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) plus Three Dollars (\$3.00) per Five Hundred Dollars
- 28 (\$500.00) of the construction cost; Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) minimum.
- 29 (45) Freestanding Signs: Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) plus Three Dollars (\$3.00) per Five Hundred
- 30 Dollars (\$500.00) of the construction cost; Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) minimum.
- 31 (46) **Wall Mounted Signs**: Fifty-five Dollars (\$55.00) each.
