De acuerdo con la ley federal y las reglamentaciones y políticas de derechos civiles del Departamento de Agricultura de los EE. UU. (U.S. Department of Agriculture, USDA), esta institución tiene prohibido discriminar por motivos de raza, color o país de origen (incluyendo dominio limitado del inglés), sexo, edad, discapacidad y represalias por actividades anteriores de derechos civiles.

Title IX of the Education Amendments Act of 1972 (Title IX) prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex, pregnancy, or parental status - in educational programs and activities that receive federal financial assistance. The law also prohibits individuals from exclusion from such programs or activities or from denial of benefits from such programs or activities based on sex. This prohibition applies to a wide array of public and private schools at the K-12 grade levels, as well as colleges and universities which receive federal funding. A school that is controlled by a religious organization is exempt from Title IX when the law's requirements would conflict with the organization's religious tenets. The law requires federally funded education institutions or programs to disseminate Title IX information widely, including the name, address, and telephone number (or other contact information) of the designated Title IX Coordinator.

Program information is available in languages other than English. Persons with disabilities who require alternative means of communication (e.g., braille, large print, audiotape, American Sign Language) should contact the responsible State or local Agency that administers the program or contact USDA through the Federal Telecommunications Relay Service at 711 (voice and TTY).

Prior to filing a Title IX complaint with USDA against an institution, a potential complainant may want to find out about the institution's grievance process and use that process to have the complaint resolved. However, a complainant is not required by law to use the institutional grievance process before filing a complaint with the Office of the Assistant Secretary of Civil Rights (OASCR). If a complainant uses an institutional grievance process and chooses to file the complaint with OASCR, the complaint must be filed with OASCR within 60 days after completion of the institutional grievance process.

To file a USDA program discrimination complaint, a complainant should complete Form AD-3027, USDA Program Discrimination Complaint Form, which can be obtained online at <https://www.usda.gov/sites/default/files/documents/ad-3027.pdf>; from any USDA office, by calling (866) 632-9992; or by writing a letter addressed to the USDA office listed below.

The letter must contain the complainant's name, address, telephone number, and a written description of the alleged discriminatory action in sufficient detail to inform OASCR about the nature and date of an alleged civil rights violation. El Título IX de la Ley de Enmiendas de Educación de 1972 (Título IX) prohíbe la discriminación por motivos de sexo, el embarazo o la situación parental) en los programas y actividades educativas que reciben asistencia financiera federal. La ley también prohíbe que las personas sean excluidas de dichos programas o actividades o que se les denieguen beneficios de dichos programas o actividades por motivos de sexo. Esta prohibición se aplica a una amplia gama de escuelas públicas y privadas en los niveles de kínder-12.º grado, y a institutos de estudios superiores y universidades que reciben fondos federales. Una escuela controlada por una organización religiosa está exenta del Título IX cuando los requisitos de la ley entrarían en conflicto con los principios religiosos de la organización. La ley exige que las instituciones o programas educativos financiados con fondos federales divulgan ampliamente la información del Título IX, incluyendo el nombre, la dirección y el número de teléfono (u otra información de contacto) del coordinador designado del Título IX.

La información del programa está disponible en otros idiomas además del inglés. Las personas con discapacidades que requieran medios de comunicación alternativos (p. ej., braille, letra grande, cintas de audio o lenguaje de señas americano) deben comunicarse con la agencia estatal o local responsable que administra el programa o comunicarse con el USDA a través del Servicio Federal de Retransmisión de Telecomunicaciones al 711 (voz y TTY).

Antes de presentar una queja del Título IX ante el USDA contra una institución, un potencial reclamante puede querer conocer el proceso de queja formal de la institución y usar ese proceso para resolver la queja. Sin embargo, la ley no exige que un reclamante use el proceso de queja formal institucional antes de presentar una queja ante la OCR. Si un reclamante usa un proceso de queja formal institucional y elige presentar la queja ante la OCR, la queja debe presentarse ante la OCR dentro de los 60 días posteriores a la finalización del proceso de queja formal institucional.

Para presentar una queja por discriminación en el programa del USDA, el reclamante debe completar el formulario AD-3027, el formulario de queja por discriminación del programa del USDA, que se puede obtener en línea en <https://www.usda.gov/sites/default/files/documents/ad-3027s.pdf>, desde cualquier oficina del USDA, llamando al (866) 632-9992, o escribiendo una carta dirigida a la oficina del USDA que se indica abajo.

La carta debe contener el nombre, la dirección, el número de teléfono del reclamante y una descripción escrita de la supuesta acción discriminatoria con suficiente detalle para informar al subsecretario de derechos civiles sobre la naturaleza y la fecha de una supuesta violación de los derechos civiles.
