FY 2003 consisti	ng of federal programs, including their federal funding applications which,
along with other	resources, serve to implement housing and community development strategies
set forth in the C	ounty's FY 2001-2005 Consolidated Plan, adopted by CR-10-2000, which Plan
was required by	the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) as a
prerequisite to co	onsideration of the funding applications.
WHEREAS	5, under the terms of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as
amended, Prince	George's County qualified as an urban county eligible to receive its twenty-
eighth year entitl	ement of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds in the amount
of \$7,023,000 an	d \$100,000 in Program Income; and
WHEREAS	s, as a federal requirement for the use of CDBG funds, project funding requests
were solicited fro	om the public through various means including conduct of a public forum; and
WHEREAS	s, under the terms of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act of
1990, as amende	d, Prince George's County is qualified to receive an eleventh year entitlement of
HOME Investme	ent Partnership (HOME) funds in the amount of \$2,767,000; and
WHEREAS	s, under the terms of the Stewart B. McKinney Homeless Assistance Act of
1988, as amende	d, Prince George's County is qualified to receive a fifteenth year entitlement of
Emergency Shelt	er Grant (ESG) program funds in the amount of \$244,000; and
WHEREAS	s, as a condition to the award of the above-referenced funds, HUD regulations

effective January 5, 1995, require Prince George's County to prepare and transmit to HUD a five-year Housing and Community Development Consolidated Plan: FY 2001-2005 (the "Consolidated Plan"); and

WHEREAS, the Consolidated Plan, adopted by CR-10-2000, was prepared following a detailed citizen participation plan, identifies and assesses housing and community development needs, incorporates a housing market analysis, and presents a strategic plan for addressing priority needs; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Subtitle 15A of the Prince George's County Code, as amended, and in accordance with the Consolidated Plan, Prince George's County is required to prepare and transmit to HUD an Annual Action Plan which describes the use of federal funds and other resources expected to be available to address priority needs according to the objectives set forth in the adopted Consolidated Plan; and

WHEREAS, under the terms of Subtitle 15A of the Prince George's County Code, as amended, the County Executive transmitted a proposed Annual Action Plan for Housing and Community Development: FY 2003, incorporating the three grant applications, and the County Council duly advertised and conducted a public hearing on the proposed Annual Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, the County Council, in recognition of public testimony and on the basis of its review and analysis of the Proposed Annual Action Plan, finds that said Plan generally conforms to the provisions and intent of Subtitle 15A, as amended;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the proposed "Annual Action Plan for Housing and Community Development: FY 2003", a copy of which shall be marked for identification by the Clerk of the County Council and maintained as a permanent record, is hereby approved in accordance with the budget summaries labeled "Attachments, A, B, and C", as attached hereto and made a part hereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County's Chief Administrative Officer is hereby authorized and empowered as the official representative of Prince George's County to submit the approved Annual Action Plan for Housing and Community Development: FY 2003 to HUD, along with all assurances contained therein, to act as necessary in connection with the submission, and to provide such additional information to HUD as may be required.
