RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission

For the purpose of modifying the System Development Charge (SDC) definition of "apartment unit" set forth in County Council Resolution 23-2000.

WHEREAS, the Maryland General Assembly adopted House Bill 883, Chapter 559, Laws of Maryland 1993, System Development Charge legislation during its 1993 Session, a bill which provides the enabling authority for the Montgomery and Prince George's County Councils to establish a fee which will be paid by applicants for new service; and

WHEREAS, the Maryland General Assembly adopted House Bill 832, Chapter 713, Laws of Maryland 1998, System Development Charge legislation during its 1998 Session, a bill which, among other things, alters the schedule for the payment of the System Development Charge to the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (WSSC) for certain properties; establishes a new maximum System Development Charge per fixture unit; allows for and limits the amount of certain exemptions; establishes a maximum System Development Charge based on the number of toilets per dwelling; authorizes a change in the maximum System Development Charge for certain residential units based on the number of toilets per dwelling; and

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council has set forth the definition of "apartment unit" for use in determining the System Development Charge fee schedule; and

WHEREAS, the WSSC, on May 11, 2000, did request that the County Councils of Prince George's and Montgomery County, Maryland, modify the definition of "apartment unit" used in determining the System Development Charge fee schedule; and

WHEREAS, the County Councils of Prince George's and Montgomery County, Maryland,

directed staff to meet and modify the definition of "apartment unit"; and

WHEREAS, the staff of both Counties have met and concurred upon modified language which was endorsed by the Council leadership on September 27, 2000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the County Council hereby amends the definition of "apartment unit" found in CR-23-2000 as follows:

Apartment unit means one of several single-family residential units within one building that is not a "multi-unit dwelling". An "apartment unit" must contain at least one full bath and kitchen, but not more than two toilets. An "apartment unit" typically includes, but is not limited to, an individual dwelling unit in a garden, medium or high-rise type residential building.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the definition of "apartment unit" approved in Prince George's County Council Resolution 23-2000, is hereby superseded by this resolution for the sole purpose of modifying the definition of "apartment unit".

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Prince George's County Council Resolution 23-2000, which took effect on July 1, 2000, and superseded Prince George's County Council Resolution 18-1999, shall remain in full force and effect, except as amended herein.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the "apartment unit" definition established herein shall take effect on the day the Montgomery County Council adopts the same definition of "apartment unit".

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the Montgomery County Council fails to enact the same definition of "apartment unit", this resolution shall be void and of no force or effect.
