

Our 'waste' has tremendous value and is now treated as a commodity.




Recyclables used to be what we kept out of the trash

PRACTICE WHAT WE PREACH SOURCE REDUCTION POLICY

- Donate, repair, refill, reuse or rebuild appliances and supplies




HOW MUCH WASTE IS GENERATED IN OUR COUNTY?

2013 ANNUAL TONNAGES


GENERATED: 1.4M TONS
