Committee Report

Committee Vote: Favorable as amended, 4-0 (In favor: Council Members Wineland, Del Giudice, Fletcher and MacKinnon)

This bill will adopt the current BOCA National Building Code, 1990 Edition and the BOCA National Mechanical Code, 1990 Edition and amend certain sections of the County Code thereby bringing the County in line with the State and other jurisdictions.

The Fire Chief submitted proposed amendments to this legislation. Suburban Maryland Building Industry Association recommended the adoption of this legislation with their proposed amendments.

The Legislative Officer was permitted to review and renumber the

sections during the codification process. The service charges for permits, license, and fees are usually established at amounts equal to enforcement and/or implementing costs, therefore, the adoption of CB-98-1991 should not result in a negative fiscal impact on the County.
