7	Sec. 23-150. Duty to remove snow <u>, ice, weeds, litter, and debris</u> .
8	(a) For the purposes of this Section only, "commercial property" shall mean any property
9	that is used to conduct a trade or business that provides goods or services to the public. It shall
10	also include properties that are zoned industrial, commercial, or residential under the provisions
11	of Subtitle 27 of this Code that are used to provide goods or services to the public.
12	(b) It shall be the duty of the owner or lessor, as the case may be, of a residential dwelling
13	unit or commercial property, unless such duty has been delegated to a lessee in actual possession,
14	to remove snow and ice from any sidewalk abutting the subject property within forty-eight (48)
15	hours after snow has fallen or ice has formed as a result of inclement weather or runoff from
16	abutting surfaces.
17	(c) It shall be the duty of the owner or lessor, as the case may be, of a residential dwelling
18	unit or commercial property, unless such duty has been delegated to a lessee in actual possession.
19	to remove litter and debris from the property line of that building, lot, or land to the edge of the
20	concrete curb and gutter adjoining the roadway in the case of an urban (closed) section roadway,
21	and from the private property line to the edge of the paved roadway surface in the case of a rural
22	(open) section roadway.
23	(d) It shall be the duty of the owner or lessor, as the case may be, of a residential dwelling
24	unit or commercial property, unless such duty has been delegated to a lessee in actual possession.
25	to keep all weeds, as defined in Section 23-102 of this Subtitle, located in the public space set
26	forth in Subsection (c) of this Section, cut to a height of not over six (6) inches.
27	[(c)] (e) The Police Department or other appropriate County enforcement agency shall be
28	responsible for enforcing the provisions of this Section.
29	[(d)] (f) Any person primarily responsible for the removal of snow [or], ice, weeds, litter,
30	or debris who breaches said duty shall be subject to a civil fine not to exceed [Fifty Dollars
31	(\$50.00)] One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each separate offense.

(g) This Section shall not apply to materials left within the public right of way as a result
of a lawfully executed eviction action, or for bulky trash left in the right of way as a result of
illegal dumping by others.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
