Committee Vote: Favorable: 4-0, (In favor: Councilmembers Bailey, Scott, Estepp and Shapiro).

This enabling legislation will authorize the County to borrow \$6,891,000 for renovation of three school capital projects, i.e., Fairmont Heights High School, DuVal High School and the former Whitehall Elementary School. These projects are being added to the FY2001 Capital Budget through a budget amendment contained in CB-14-2001. With the State allocation of \$6.1 million, the total amount to be expended for renovation is \$13 million.

There will be no fiscal impact on the County related to the enactment of CB-15-2001. However, there will be a negative fiscal impact to the extent of the debt service obligation incurred by the County when the bonds are sold. The amount of the negative fiscal impact cannot be determined at this time.

This bill will authorize the County to borrow \$6,891,000 for the renovation of three school capital projects, i.e., Fairmont Heights High School, DuVal High School and the former Whitehall Elementary School. The State has allocated \$6.1 million for these three schools, bringing the total amount to be spent for renovation purposes to \$13 million.
