Vote: Favorable, 7-0-1 (In favor: Council Members Franklin, Davis, Harrison, Lehman, Olson, Patterson, and Toles; Abstained: Council Member Turner; Absent: Council Members Campos.)

This charter amendment bill was introduced on June 30, 2014 and was heard in Committee of the Whole on July 8, 2014.

The purpose of CB-54-2014 is to increase the number of consecutive terms that a person may serve on the County Council or as County Executive from two terms to three terms.

The bill was favorably voted out of the Committee of the Whole on July 8, 2014 by a vote of 7-0-1. (Campos absent & Turner abstained)
