A RESOLUTION concerning		
	Temporary County-based Business Certification	
For the purpose of temporarily considering local businesses with certain existing business		
certifications to be certified County-based businesses for the purposes of Section 10A-101(13) of		
the Code.		
WHEREAS, the County enacted Council Bill 17-2011 ("CB-17-2011") to provide		
businesses headquartered in Prince George's County with a greater opportunity to compete for		
contracts for goods and services procured by the County; and		
WHEREAS, CB-17-2011 requires local firms that already have existing recognized		
business certifications to complete a new County-based business certification process; and		
WHEREAS, the introduction of a new business certification process can be confusing and		
often requires a significant period of transition so that outreach efforts to the local business		
community will successfully encourage businesses to complete the new certification process; and		
WHEREAS, currently, a significant number of local firms with existing business		
certifications have yet to complete the County's new business certification process established by		
CB-17-2011; and	I	
WHEREAS, certain existing business certifications already recognized by the Office of		
Central Services can alternatively establish that the principal place of operation of a business is		
within Prince George's County, MD; and		
WHEREAS, the success of CB-17-2011 is contingent on having a sufficient number of		
ocal firms certified as County-based businesses; and		

WHEREAS, Section 1017(c) of the Charter for Prince George's County provides that a

resolution adopted by the Council shall have the force and effect of law but of a temporary or administrative character.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that a business whose business domicile and principal place of operation is located in Prince George's County, MD, as determined by the Director of Central Services, and is

- (a) certified as a minority business enterprise pursuant to Section 10A-101(a)(26); or
- (b) certified as a socially or economically disadvantaged business pursuant to 13 CFR Part 124 8(a) (the "Section 8A Program") by the Small Business Administration; or
- (c) certified as a HUBZone small business concern pursuant to 13 CFR 126 (the Federal "HUBZone program") by the Small Business Administration is a certified County-based business for the purposes of Section 10A-101(13) of the Code.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Central Services or the Director of Central Services' designee may require the submission of any documentation or require other information deemed necessary to establish the eligibility of a business for the purposes of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the effect of this resolution shall expire on July 1, 2015, but shall continue for procurements awarded prior to its expiration (not including any contract renewals or extensions occurring after July 1, 2015).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council urges eligible local businesses to utilize this temporary certification period to obtain certification as a County-based business or County-based small business as established by CB-17-2011.
